

Gull Proof Bag User Guide

What are Gull Proof Bags?

Gull proof bags are strong reusable bags which are used to collect **general household waste** in some streets in the World Heritage Site. They help protect your waste from gulls.

They are normally used alongside kerbside recycling collections for certain materials such as paper, card, cans, plastics, glass and food.

Gull proof bags are collected between 6.30am and 4.00pm, one day each week.

How to Use Gull Proof Bags

- Only put your bag out on the correct day.
- Put your bag out no later than 6.30am and bring it inside after it has been emptied.
- Make sure you use the ties on the bag to fasten it to something solid, e.g. railings, so it does not blow away.
- No loose waste. Please make sure your waste is contained in a large bin bag.
- Don't use bins in nearby streets to dispose of your waste - this causes them to overflow.

BROKEN GLASS AND SHARP OBJECTS

TO AVOID INJURY TO OUR STAFF, PLEASE ENSURE ALL SHARP OBJECTS ARE WELL WRAPPED AND NOT PROTRUDING FROM ANY PLASTIC BAGS.

Please Note

- Bags are emptied manually, that's why we ask you to use large bin bags (e.g. black bags or similar).
- Loose items or small bags (e.g. carrier bags) won't be uplifted.
