1. Minute

Decision

To approve the minute of the Policy Development and Review Sub-Committee of the Health, Wellbeing and Housing Committee of 23 April 2013 as a correct record.

2. Supporting People with Dementia – Drama Production and Discussion

Naomie Breeze of Breeze Productions provided a drama production - "Seeing Auntie" - on Supporting People with Dementia.

This explored one person's experience of dementia and how it affected a whole family.

Following the drama production, the Sub-Committee and invited participants split into discussion groups to consider the issues raised in the drama production. Their feedback on the top three priorities for developing a dementia friendly community included:-

Table 1 (Facilitator – Catriona Lyon, Planning and Commissioning Officer - Older People, Health and Social Care)

- Pre-diagnosis support mechanisms being put in place.
- Training across communities and appropriate support facilities being established.

- Work being carried out with the voluntary sector and partners.

Table 2 (Facilitator – Karen Thom, Planning & Commissioning Officer (Older People Health and Social Care)

- Awareness training in key service areas, such as the police and retail outlets, being implemented.
- Implementing a pilot scheme for two weeks.
- Piloting the idea of “circles of support”.

Table 3 (Facilitator - Caroline Clarke, Planning & Commissioning Officer (Older People, Health and Social Care)

- The provision of information and awareness-raising on what was most important for older people. This should also include retailers and partners, such as the health service, Lothian Buses, the Police and the Fire Brigade.
- A strategic linking being implemented to include all Council departments, and partners including the health service, the police, the fire service and public transport.
- Consideration being given to environmental issues, including planning and housing.

Table 4 (Facilitator – Olive Bain, Acting Housing Support Manager, Services for Communities)

- Awareness of dementia being raised in schools and this should be built into the curriculum.
- Engagement with retailers taking place, with the increased usage of signage for dementia.
- Addressing signage issues in general, to help people with dementia.
