1. Background

- 1.1 The Council licenses Café Renee as a street trader on the Mound.

2. Main report

- 2.1 An issue has arisen about the location of this Street Trading Licence. Members will be aware that this area is also being used for the Winter Festival and Hogmanay celebrations.
- 2.2 An agreement has been reached between the parties to relocate this stall in order to accommodate the continued operation of the licence and the events. The application and location are set out in Appendices 1 and 2.
- 2.3 Separately the licence holder is seeking permission to change the style of his stall to one more in keeping with the festive events, see Appendix 1. Finally the licence holder is seeking permission to extend his hours to 8pm for the period of the winter festivals.
- 2.4 A variation is a fundamental change to the licence and requires Committee approval.
