# Stopping Up Order – Lovers' Lane, Right of Way, Cycle Track and Core Path, South Queensferry, Edinburgh

#### Recommendations

- 1.1 That the Sub-Committee note the objections made when the City of Edinburgh Council (Lovers' Lane, Right of Way, Cycle Track and Core Path, South Queensferry Edinburgh) (Stopping Up) Order 2015 was advertised to the public.
- 1.2 That the stopping up order is passed to the Scottish Ministers to hold a Public Inquiry.

## **Main report**

- 2.1 To facilitate implementation of a grant of approval of full planning permission (reference 11/00995/PPP and 13/03310/AMC) for the mixed use development of 450 houses and flats and commercial building, at the former Agilent Technologies, Scotstoun Avenue, South Queensferry a stopping up order is required.
- 2.2 The stopping up of the right of way, cycle track and core path, known as Lovers' Lane and the construction of a new route were considered in a report to the Development Management Sub-Committee on 4 December 2013. Cala Homes, the developer of the area, has supplied plans showing the section of Lovers' Lane to be stopped up and the new route to the east. These plans are attached in the appendix to this report.
- 2.3 The stopping up of Lovers' Lane was progressed under the terms of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1997, Section 208. The order was advertised to the public from 10 March 2015 to 10 April 2015. Two objections have been received and for the stopping up order to proceed the representations require to be passed to the Scottish Ministers for determination.
- 2.4 Both objections are on the grounds that Lovers' Lane is a safe path with no motor vehicle access. The objectors are concerned that the new route through the housing development will have to be shared with other vehicles.

- They also consider that area to be of environmental interest and it should be kept to involve children from the local schools in the teaching of wildlife corridors and biodiversity.
- 2.5 The present route requires persons to cross Scotstoun Avenue, the main access road into the development, to travel from Lovers' Lane to the north section of the route. The new route will be on a dedicated surface with only a minor road to cross and it is considered that this will be safer than maintaining the present route. With regard to the other uses of Lovers' Lane, planning permission has already been given to build in the surrounding fields. Maintaining the existing route would place it between two house estates and inevitably change the environmental landscape.

#### Measures of success

3.1 The planning permission will be implemented in full.
