Craigentenny & Duddingston Neighbourhood Partnership: Community Grants Fund Report

1. Purpose of the Report

To provide details of applications to the Neighbourhood Partnership's Community Grants Fund in 2015/16, and to ask the Partnership to advise the Neighbourhood Manager about how they wish to proceed relating to the new applications included in this report.

2. Main report

Grant applications are invited from fully constituted organisations with open membership criteria.

The Partnership's Community Grants Fund Budget for 2015/16 is £22,810. To date two applications have been received.

3. New Applications

Royal High Primary School Parent Council:

The application is for £2,000 to purchase and install a food preparation area, educational outdoor equipment to develop the school playground growing area. Children would plant their own food products and learn about all the benefits of growing their own food from beginning to end and healthy eating. The application meets the criteria for outcomes linked to: *Improving Health and Wellbeing and Supporting Children, Young People and Families.*

Northfield Willowbrae Community Council:

The application is for £2,000 to install two high-quality and vandal-proof notice boards to display community information, managed by but not solely used for material produce by the Community Council. The notice boards would be placed in areas of high footfall and could be used in a variety of ways to provide information to the wider community. The application meets the criteria for outcomes linked to: *Improving Health and Wellbeing and Creating Safe, Clean and Strong Communities.*

4. Financial Implications

The two new applications amount to £4,000 and are the first applications in this financial year.

5. Recommendations

5.1 The Partnership is asked to:

- Consider the applications outlined in paragraph 3 and advise the Neighbourhood Manager how they wish to proceed.
