### Executive summary

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The Committee is asked to consider a request by a private hire car licence holder that his licence conditions may be varied so that he may remove the 'Pre-booked Hires Only' stickers from his private hire car.

## Request for Variation – Private Hire Car Licence – Sameer Khan

### Recommendations

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- 1.1 The Committee is asked to note the terms of the request and to refuse the request on the basis that the applicant has not demonstrated that executive work is a substantial part of his operations.

### Background

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- 2.1 On 22 May 2009, the Regulatory Committee approved a requirement that all private hire cars would have to carry self adhesive plastic oval signs on their front doors stating 'Pre-booked Hires Only'.
- 2.2 The Sub-Committee has only granted similar variations in five previous cases. These applicants were granted exemption as they established that they carried out a higher proportion of specialised high quality executive/tourism work throughout Scotland. For example, one operator said that 70% of his work came from this source rather than general private hire car work. Two operators provided letters from a number of hotels which confirmed that they would not use the private hire car vehicle if the door stickers were attached.
- 2.3 One licence holder, who claimed that 30% of his business was executive or wedding hires, appealed against refusal of his request for variation. The Sheriff considered that the Sub-Committee had not acted unreasonably when refusing his request.

### Main report

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- 3.1 A request for variation of licence has been received from Sameer Khan. Details of the application and supporting documents provided by him are attached in [Appendix 1](#). Each application should be considered on its own merits. Previous decisions of the Committee provide context but are not binding upon the Committee.
- 3.2 The applicant has been invited to attend Committee to speak in support of the application.
- 3.3 If the Committee agrees to allow the variation, the Committee is asked to note that the variation would only apply to that particular vehicle whilst it is licensed by that operator and that, if the vehicle is replaced, the variation would no longer apply. Additionally, the rear licence plate on the vehicle would be required to be

amended to carry the wording “Door Sticker Exemption’ as required by the policy.
