Late Hours Catering Licence - Festival Stores

Recommendations

The Committee is asked to:

- 1.1 Hear the objections and from officers noting that, other than the objections, there are no grounds to refuse the application.

Background

- 2.1 The application process for a Late Hours Catering Licence includes a requirement that a site notice is displayed for 21 days prior to the licence being issued.

Main report

- 3.1 This application was first brought before the Licensing Sub-Committee in December 2015. It was not heard at this time as the site notice had not been displayed for the statutory period of 21 days.
- 3.2 The application was continued to the 29 January 2016 Licensing Sub-Committee to allow for display of the notice. The Sub-Committee further requested information and the report was continued for this to be provided.
- 3.3 No issues have been identified which would preclude the grant of the licence. The information requested is attached at Appendix 1 and 2.
- 3.4 It has now been confirmed that the relevant notice has been correctly displayed as required.

Measures of success

- 4.1 Late hours catering is licensed in a proportionate and effective manner.

Financial impact

- 5.1 The costs of applications for late hours catering licences are met entirely from application fees.
