- She works 16 Hours Per Week on minimum vage
- wage She received Child Benefit, Child Tax Credit & Working Tax Credit
- evious domestic violence and subsequent melessness
- homelessness Rents a 2 bed private flat for £650.00 per mont! At risk of eviction due to failure to pay rent Refused Housing Benefit and council tax reduction despite her low income Leyla disclosed her family have no beds and they sleep on the floor
