


- Full time advice worker in 6 schools

Year 2 model – MAXIMISE!

Long term, holistic model of intensive family support

- Advice Worker (full time)
- Family Support Worker (full time)
- Employability Worker (part time)
- Cluster of schools
 - Primary
 - Secondary





- Advice income maximisation, debt and housing issues. Providing greater financial stability where applicable and addressing inequalities.
- Intensive Family Support looking at the core issues that may affect the whole family and addressing these, stabilising families, and increasing independence. It may also include prevention work and assisting people to move forwards.
- Employability promoting independence and supporting families to engage in employment and/or employability related activities, breaking down inequalities.

Key Elements

- Partnership approach, CHAI, Children 1st, NHS Lothian, EH&SCP, 1 in 5, CEC, School Cluster (Liberton Cluster)
- Aims to increase children's positive participation in school life and education attainment, reducing the attainment gap between higher and lower income families.
- Maximise! Uses a whole family support approach: addressing the wider issues that often impact families affected by poverty

<u>Referrals</u>

- Advertising campaign
- Teachers
- Social work
- Self referral
- Local service

Parents are seen in a convenient place for them



The need – poverty related issues

- Earn less than the living wage
- Zero hour contracts
- Unemployment
- Inability to pay for household essentials i.e food
- Financial debt
- In arrears with bills
- Homelessness
- Non suitable housing conditions


