DANGEROUS WILD ANIMALS ACT 1976

STANDARD CONDITIONS

- 1. The animal(s) shall be kept by no person other than the person or persons specified in the licence.
- 2. The animal(s) shall normally be held at the premises specified in this licence.
- 3. The animal(s) shall not be moved from those premises or shall only be moved from them in the circumstances specified in the licence.
- 4. Any animal which is kept outside the area of the authority issuing the licence, for any continuous period exceeding 72 hours, the licensee will inform the said local authority prior to this event.
- 5. A current insurance policy shall be held by the licensee to cover liability for any damage which may be caused by the animal(s). The terms of this policy shall be satisfactory to the City of Edinburgh Council.
- 6. The licensee shall at all reasonable times make available a copy of the licence to any person entitled to keep any animal under the authority of the licence.
- 7. Animal(s) must be kept in escape proof accommodation of an adequate size. The temperatures, lighting and ventilation must be kept at a suitable level. The accommodation must be well drained and clean.
- 8. An adequate supply of suitable food, drink and bedding must be provided.
- 9. The animal(s) must be visited at regular intervals.
- 10. Appropriate steps must be taken to protect the animal(s) from fire or other emergency.
- 11. Reasonable precautions must be taken to prevent and control the spread of infectious disease.
- 12. Animal(s) must have space to take adequate exercise.
- 13. The licensee shall permit any veterinary surgeon or veterinary practitioner or officer of the local authority to inspect (subject to compliance with such precautions as the authority may specify to prevent the spread among animals of infectious or contagious diseases) the premises in respect of providing a report for the determination of the granting or renewal of a licence, and shall allow such a person, on producing his authority if so required to enter any such premises at all reasonable times and inspect them and any animals found there, for the purpose of ascertaining whether an offence has been or is being committed.
