Purpose of the briefing



- You are key stakeholders
- You provide scrutiny of polling and the count
 - Transparency
 - Trust
 - Interests of the voter
- To **scrutinise** you must understand
 - Processes
 - What happens, where and when
- Give confidence to the voter



Who's who Roles and responsibilities



- The **Returning Officer (RO)** is the person responsible for running the election. The RO is **Andrew Kerr**,
 - Also Chief Executive of the City of Edinburgh Council
- The Electoral Registration Officer (ERO) is responsible for maintaining the register of electors and absent voters' lists. The ERO is Graeme Strachan
 - Contact details will be given at the end
- The Electoral Commission
 - Campaign spending, guidance, regulation, reporting
- Others
 - Police Scotland
 - Royal Mail etc

Delivery of return as to election expenses	17 January 2020 (assuming result is declared on 13 December) + 35 calendar days from result
Deadline for sending postal vote identifier rejection notices	11 March 2020

- Notice of Election 8 November
- Notice of Poll 14 November
- Statement of Persons Nominated/ Situation of Polling Stations – 14 November
- Election Agents Appointed **14 November**



Election agent

- Responsible for the proper management of your election campaign; particularly its financial management.
- Notification of appointment must have reached the RO by 4pm on 14 November.
- You will have become your own agent by default if none was appointed.





Other agents

 Other agents can be appointed to attend postal vote openings, polling stations and the count on your behalf:



- You must give notice in writing of any people appointed as polling and counting agents by **5 December.** We have provided forms.
- The appointment of postal voting agents attending a particular opening session must be made before the start of each session. We will give at least 48 hours' notice sent by email to candidates and agents. (*email was sent 19 November*)



Free candidate mailing

- All candidates who are validly nominated are entitled to send one election communication, free of charge, to electors across the constituency.
- It must include matters relating to the election only.
- You can choose to send either:
 - one unaddressed election communication of up to 60 grams to every postal address, or
 - one election communication of up to 60 grams addressed to each elector
- contact Royal Mail to make arrangements





Access to electoral register / absent voting lists

- Access by candidates once you **officially** became a candidate:
 - earliest, on 6 November if you, or others, have declared yourself a candidate on or before this date
 - after 6 November, once you or others have declared yourself a candidate or you submit your nomination papers, whichever is earliest
- Make written request to the ERO forms are in the Nomination Pack

Access to electoral register / absent voting lists

- Only use data for permitted purposes
 - to complete the nomination form
 - to help you campaign
 - to check that donations/loans are permissible

An update from the Electoral Registration Officer



Campaigning dos and don'ts

- Do use *imprints* on all your campaign material
- Do comply with planning rules relating to advertising hoardings and large banners
 - **No posters** affixed to street furniture
- Do not produce material that looks like a poll card
- Do not pay people to display your adverts (unless they display adverts as part of their normal business).

A Boards



Edinburgh 2019



- There is a special dispensation for the use of A-Boards associated with elections on polling days. The terms of use are:
 - Use only during the hours of polling 7am-10pm;
 - Sited off the pavement whenever possible;
 - Sited so as to avoid any obstruction to pedestrians; and
 - Sited so as to avoid any obstruction to access to the polling place.







Code of conduct for campaigners

Campaigners are an essential element of a healthy democracy, but their activities should not bring into question the integrity of the electoral process

• Electoral registration and absent vote applications:

- Ensure forms conform fully to the requirements of electoral law
- Include the ERO's address for the return of forms
- Ensure unaltered applications are sent to ERO within two working days
- Make sure electors understand implications of applying for an absent vote
- Do not encourage postal ballot pack redirection
- Do not encourage electors to appoint a campaigner as proxy.

NOTE DEADLINE HAS NOW PASSED

Code of conduct for campaigners

Postal ballot packs:



- Never touch a postal ballot paper
- Never observe electors completing their postal vote
- Never handle or take any completed ballot paper or postal ballot packs from voters.

Campaigning outside polling places:

- You are allowed to put your messages to voters on polling day, including in public spaces outside polling places
- Keep access to polling places and the pavements around polling places clear to allow voters to enter.

Postal Votes



•In UKPGE 2017

- 22.7% of electorate were postal voters
- 84.3% turnout of postal voters
- 27% of the votes we counted were postal votes
- Very important part of election - equivalent to a whole constituency
- Confidence in the system depends on integrity of campaigners: Code of Conduct!
- Must be seen to be fair, no question of interference

Postal Votes

Dispatched on 27 November

Deadline 26 November

- Code of conduct no candidate or supporter should put themselves in a position where their honesty or integrity, or that of the candidate or party, can be questioned
- For security reasons, absent voters are required to provide signature and date of birth on applications
 - these are stored electronically and checked against the postal voting statement returned with the postal vote
- If you are considering printing your own application forms, they must contain all the legislative requirements
- It is important that any received applications are returned to the electoral registration office or postal vote packs are returned to the elections office as soon as possible to ensure adequate time for processing



Postal Vote Opening





- Postal vote openings
 - From 10am 6 December Highland Hall, Ingliston
 - Ballot Papers will be face down
 - Signature and DOB checked electronically
 - Secrecy Requirement
- Each candidate may appoint agents to observe the opening of postal votes
 - Appointments must be made in writing before the opening session is due to begin
- Lost or spoilt can be replaced



Polling Day 5 Constituencies 7am **141 Polling Places** to 10pm **298 Polling Stations**



- Polling stations open from 7am to 10pm.
- Election Office open 6am to 10pm for any queries or problems relating to the administration of the election
 - for queries relating to election finance issues, contact the Electoral Commission (contact details shown later)
 - Some issues may be escalated to the Police

Polling Day 12/12

- Voters in the polling station or in a queue outside the polling station at 10pm can apply for a ballot paper.
- Postal votes can be handed into polling places within the constituency or delivered to the City Chambers until 10pm.
- A person in a queue at a polling station at 10pm waiting to hand in postal vote can do so after 10pm.



Polling Day

Key information



- Behaviour of "tellers"
 - Dos and Don'ts!
 - Requirement for secrecy
 - Obey instructions of Presiding Officer, Returning Officer, Police Scotland
 - Candidates and Agents are responsible for managing the behaviour of their supporters
- Selfies...not allowed to preserve secret ballot!
- Visually impaired can use phones to "read" paper



Polling Agents





Guidance from Electoral Commission

- Canvassing / Literature
- General Behaviour

• Must have and wear ID in the Polling stations

- should also introduce themselves to the Presiding Officer and sign in.
- No Posters on Street Furniture
 - Will be removed and you will be charged
- Problems on the day: contact

Counting of votes



Elections

- The count will be held in:
 - Highland Hall, Royal Highland Centre, Ingliston
- Count centre will open to candidates and agents from 9:45pm
 - Accreditation passes needed
- Candidates, election agents, counting agents and one other person appointed by the candidate are entitled to attend



1 Counting Agent per table per candidate = 24 each




Candidate spending

- Defined as certain expenses 'used for the purposes of the candidate's election' during the regulated period
- Responsibility of Election Agent
- Limit on expenses: See next slide
- Must get and keep receipts (over £20)
- What you spend on activities to promote your candidacy or to criticise other candidates in the run-up to the election
 - Transparent prove the election is not "bought"
 - Level playing field









Candidates' spending returns

- Returns due 35 calendar days after result of election
 - •17 January 2020 (assuming result is declared on 13 December
- Returns made public by Returning Officer
- Sample of returns may be reviewed by the Electoral Commission
- Failure to submit an expenses return is a criminal offence enforceable by the police
- No spending will be reimbursed

 - Integrity is fundamental
- Police Scotland (SPOC)
 - Bribery
 - Treating
 - Undue Influence
 - Personation
 - False Statements
- Candidates, Agents and campaigners have critical role to ensure integrity and confidence in the electoral process
- All allegations of electoral fraud will be investigated robustly by the Police Scotland in consultation with RO
