

Costs: Monthly packages vary from £58 to £290.
Regus	Regus: The world's largest provider of flexible workplaces is spread in 8 locations in Scotland's capital city. Regus satisfies every coworking need, with their flexible coworking options, all the necessary amenities for work, bookable meeting rooms, available on an hourly basis, and an excellent networking opportunity. **Summary:** Example of a third sector organisation that has ambitious growth plans and needs a good infrastructure to make this happen. They are potential tenants for a similar project in Leith, Duncan Place.

## **Current Situation & Rent:**

- The organisation is 12 years old, 170 students, 40 on the waiting list. 4 senior office-based staff, 98 case managers, teachers etc.
- Currently bases:
  - St Margarets House but it doesn't really meet their needs. 3 art rooms at St Mags. 1 small, 2 larger. Used full time, daily between 4-10 students each day. Reduced rent because they have been there a long time. (est £8 sq ft)
  - <u>Links House</u> top floor office for their head office, IT, employability staff etc. double the St Mags rent. Negotiated 3 months rent free. £15 sq ft. Within a complex. They have concierge service, lifts etc which is included. Includes utilities but not phones etc.
  - o <u>Industrial estate</u> (near Duncan Place)- renting unit and using containers to convert it into a performing arts hub. £48,000 a year for 500,200sq ft.
  - o Also looking at another <u>cafe and shop front</u>.
  - o Gorebridge looking at the police station opposite The Hub.
- They would look to rent space full time but sublet the rooms evenings and weekends. Mostly to people they already know, art staff or yoga etc. Staff could lock up on the evenings.
- Need sinks place to wash artists equipment would need to put this in.
