**Explanation** In principle new hotel provision should be accessible by public transport. However, CEC should be mindful that the impact of COVID-19 on Edinburgh's Tourism sector will be significant and potentially long reaching. There were already concerns that the current pipeline of new hotels in the city, both under construction and with planning approval, was going to result in an oversupply of rooms that would drive down occupancy and room rates. Added to that, there were concerns about overtourism in the city pre-CoVid19 and a clear ambition to drive future growth via spend rather than volume of visitors. Now, there is no clear picture on the outlook for Edinburgh's tourism sector post CoVid19. The city has a far stronger international visitor profile than Scotland as a whole (44% v 23%), which in most circumstances would be considered a strength, but is now a real challenge as this market is likely to be far slower to recover, so demand levels are likely to be substantially down on 2019 levels for years to come. Given the above, SE believes that the city should hold off on making a final decision about new hotel development policy until the situation is clearer and we have a better understanding of what future demand is likely to be, as the priority for the foreseeable future should be supporting the financial viability of the existing businesses.

It may therefore be prudent to continue to allow more flexibility to support changing market demand and CEC should consider updating their office demand and supply assessment in light of COVID-19 before committing to a particular policy. There should also be a recognition that the physical constraints of listed buildings in the city centre may not be capable of meet modern office requirements on a financially viable basis and existing offices may not currently be located in the most accessible locations.
