### THE CITY OF EDINBURGH COUNCIL (GILMERTON CROSSROADS, EDINBURGH) (TEMPORARY ROAD RESTRICTION AND TRAFFIC REGULATION) ORDER 2021 - TEMP/21/133.

THE CITY OF EDINBURGH COUNCIL in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 14 (1) (b) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf hereby make the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as "The City of Edinburgh Council (Gilmerton Crossroads, Edinburgh) (Temporary Road Restriction and Traffic Regulation) Order 2021" and shall come into operation on the Nineteenth day of July Two thousand and twenty-one and shall remain in force up to and including the Eighteenth day of January Two thousand and twenty-three (18 months to the day). The restrictions within this Order, to facilitate improved safety for pedestrians and cyclists during the current Covid-19 pandemic, supporting social distancing so that people can safely walk, wheel or cycle, will be subject to ongoing review and should it be determined that the restrictions are no longer required, then at that time the temporary restrictions shall be revoked by notice, under a separate Order.
2. (a) In this Order the following phrases have the meanings respectively assigned to them:
  - "Article" means an Article of this Order;
  - "parking attendant" has the same meaning as in Section 63A of the 1984 Act;
  - "road" has the same meaning as in Section 151 of the Roads (Scotland) act 1984 and, for the avoidance of doubt, for the purposes of this order, includes part of a road;
  - "vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 151 of the Roads (Scotland) act 1984;(b) References in this Order to a disabled person, to a disabled person's badge, to a disabled person's vehicle and to a vehicle displaying a disabled person's badge in the relevant position shall be construed in accordance with the 1984 Act, The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Scotland) Regulations 2000 and The Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (Scotland) Regulations 2002.
3. Save as provided in Article 4 of this Order, no person shall, except with the permission of a Parking Attendant: - cause or permit any vehicle to wait or load onto or unload from any vehicle on: (a) **Gilmerton Road, East side**, from a point 19 metres or thereby north of the extended north kerbline of Ferniehill Drive, northwards for a distance of 12 metres or thereby; (b) **Newtoft Street, North Side**, from a point 18 metres or thereby west of the extended west kerbline of Gilmerton Road, westwards for a distance of 45 metres or thereby; (c) **Drum Street, North Side** (i) from a point 66 metres or thereby west of the extended west kerbline of East Farm of Gilmerton, westwards for a distance of 7 metres or thereby; (ii) from a point 11 metres or thereby east of the extended east kerbline of East Farm of Gilmerton, eastwards for a distance of 25 metres or thereby; (iii) from a point 51 metres or thereby east of the extended east kerbline of East Farm of Gilmerton, eastwards for a distance of 16 metres or thereby; and (d) **Drum Street, South Side**, (i) from a point 15 metres or thereby east of the extended east kerbline of Ravenscroft Street, eastwards for a distance of 58 metres or thereby; (ii) From a point 11 metres or thereby east of the extended east kerbline of Limefield, eastwards for a distance of 54 metres or thereby; and (iii) from the east kerbline of Drum Cottages, eastwards for a distance of 43 metres or thereby.

4. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall apply:
- (i) to emergency service vehicles;
  - (ii) so as to prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in any road described in said Schedule while the vehicle is in actual use for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or while loading or unloading goods from or to premises adjoining the said road; provided that:
    - (a) no such vehicle so engaged shall wait for a period of more than thirty minutes in the same place; and
    - (b) no such vehicle so engaged shall return to the same place, unless a period of more than thirty minutes has elapsed since the termination of the previous waiting period.
  - (iii) to a vehicle displaying a valid disabled person's badge, provided that said vehicle is being used by, or for the conveyance of, the holder of a valid disabled person's badge.
5. The City of Edinburgh Council (Traffic Regulation; Restrictions on Waiting, Loading and Unloading, Stopping and Parking Places) Designation and Traffic Regulation Order 2018 is hereby suspended in so far as it is affected by the measures described in Article 3 of this Order.
