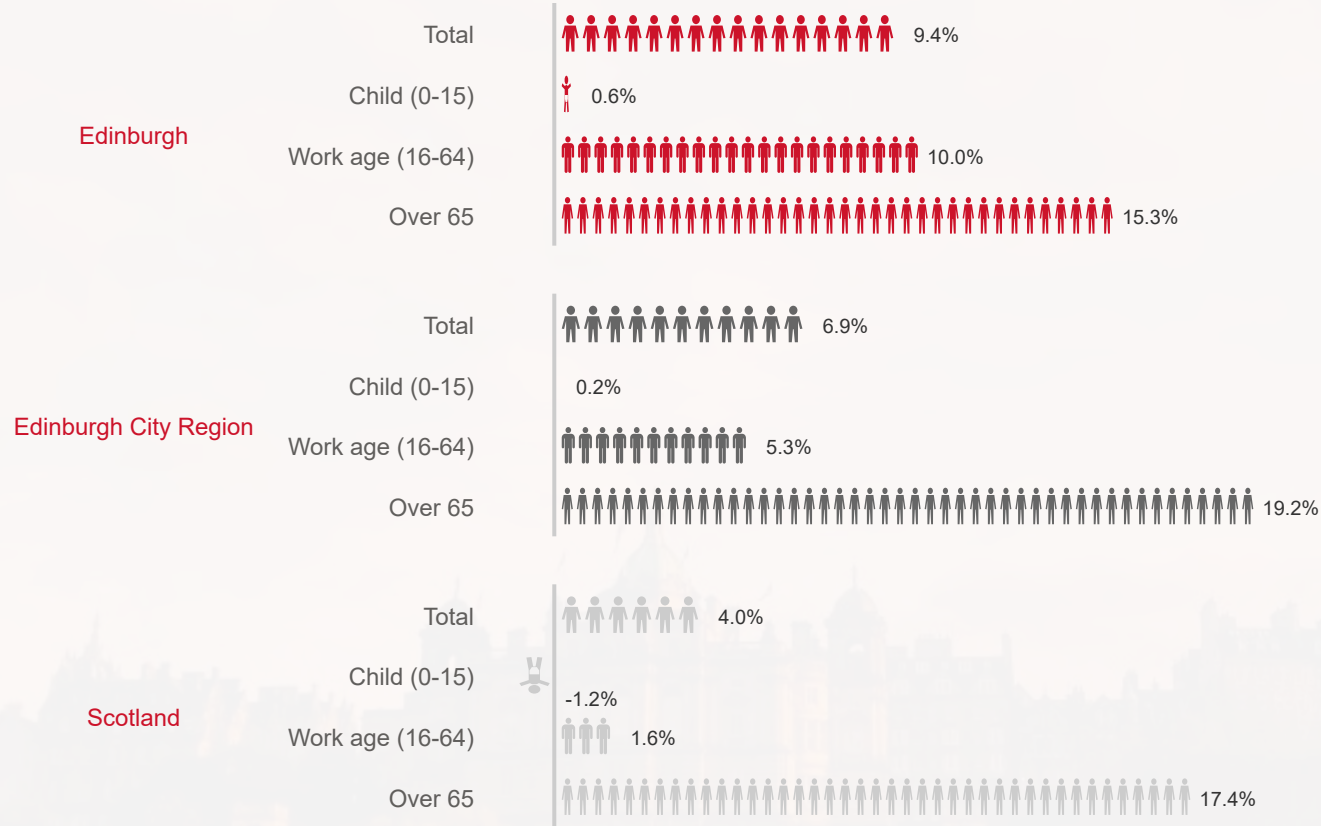

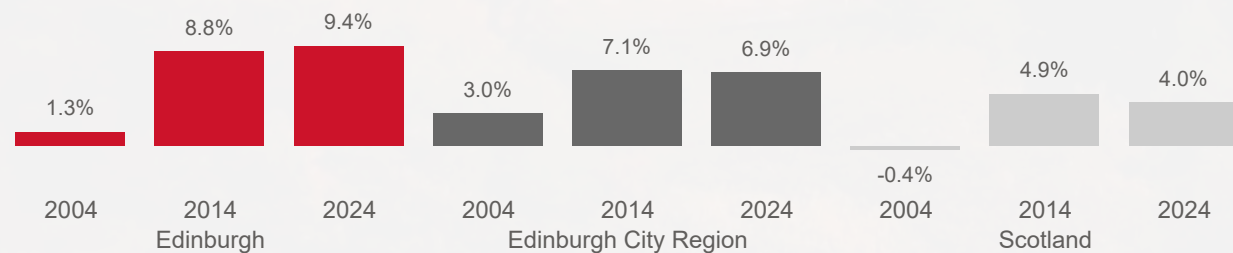

Key Facts

In the ten years to 2024, Edinburgh's population grew by 9.4% from an estimated 485,270 to an estimated 530,680 people. In the same time period Scotland's population grew by 4%. Edinburgh's population shows growth in each age group, including a small growth in the child population. Child population decreased in Scotland by 1.2%. Edinburgh and Scotland saw increases of over 15% in the older population.

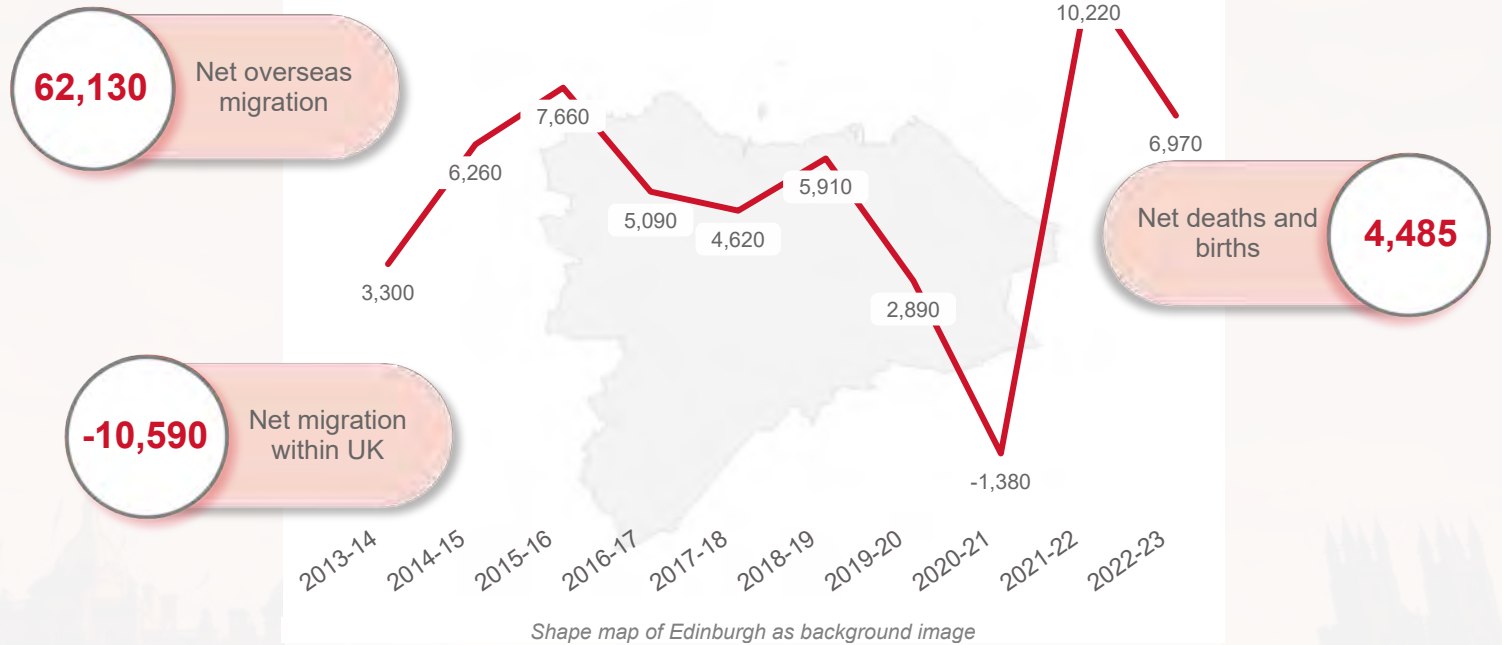

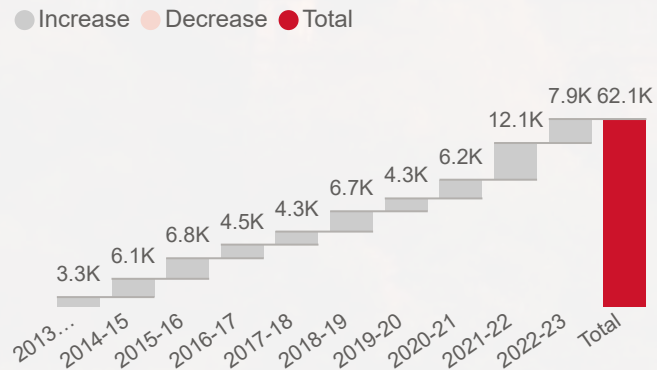
Overseas migration continues to be the main driver of population change in Edinburgh. The net effect of births and deaths on Edinburgh's population from 2013 to 2023 was 4,485. The net effect of migration was more than ten times higher at 51,540.

Edinburgh's net birth and death rate reduced from a net increase of 1,261 in 2013/14 to a net increase of 20 in 2022/23. The size of overseas migration to Edinburgh reduced from the period 2021/22 (12,130) to 7,920 in 2022/23, while the net migration within UK continued to decrease.

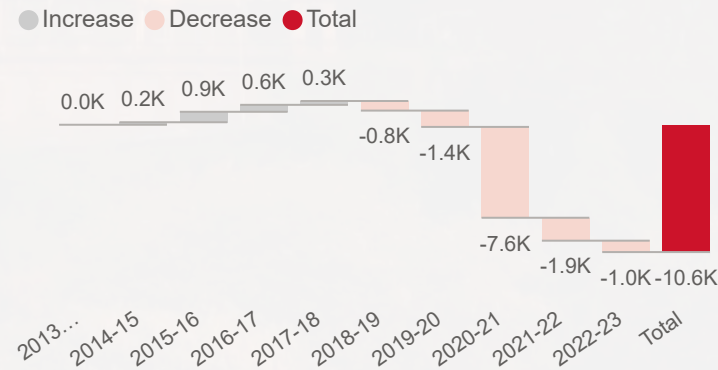
Net population change in Edinburgh by year in the last decade



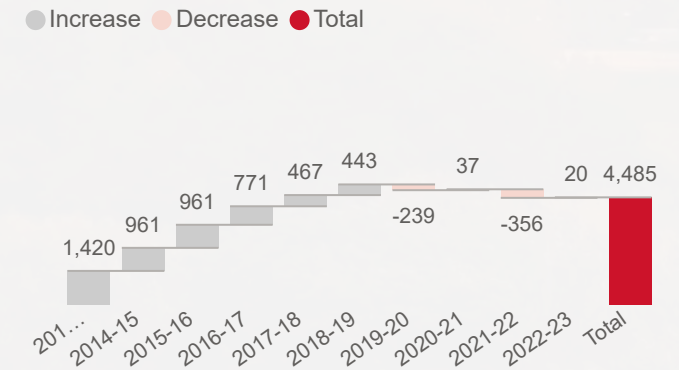
Net overseas migration to Edinburgh in the last decade

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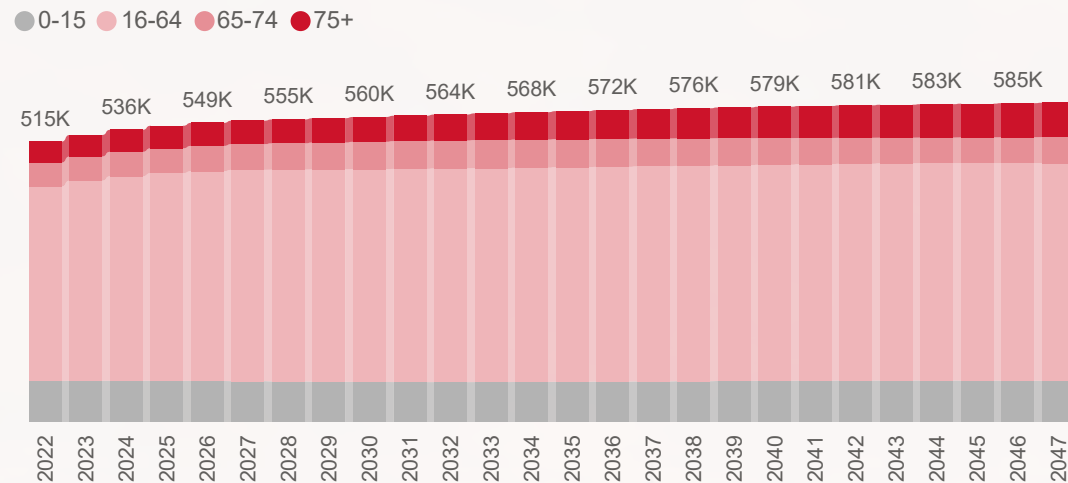

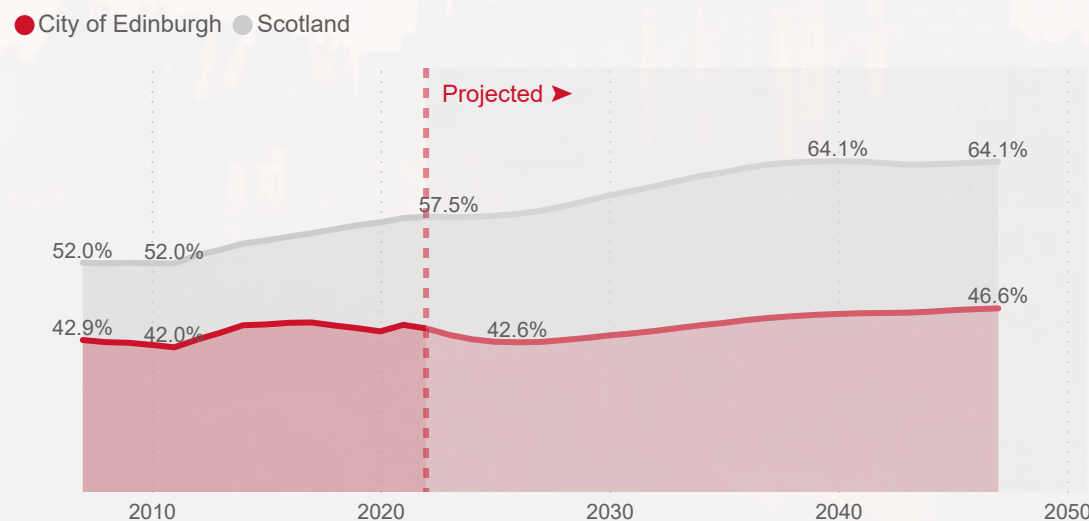

Edinburgh and Scotland dependency rate (0-15 years old and 0-64 years old divided by working age population) from 2007 to 2047

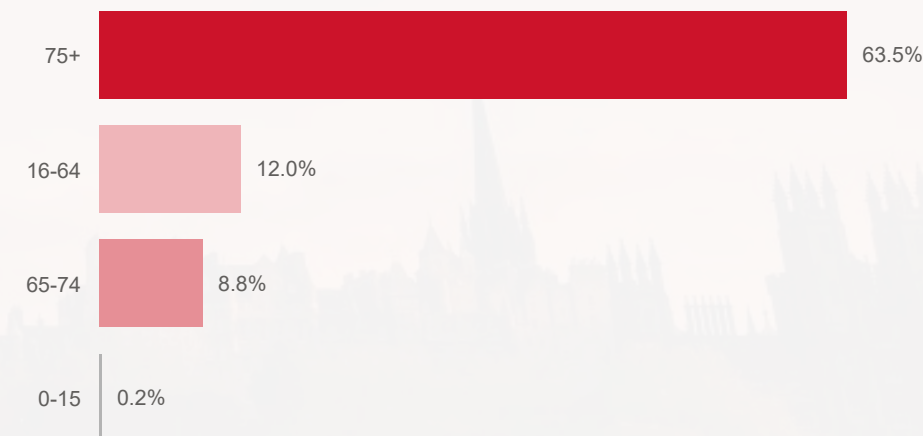

Did you know...?

The dependency rate is calculated by dividing the persons aged under 16 and over 64 by the working age (16 to 64) population. The rate describes how much pressure an economy faces in supporting its non working age population.

Key Facts

Edinburgh population is projected to grow to 585,838 by 2047. According to these projections, the proportion of dependants in Edinburgh will represent almost half of the population. The dependency rate, currently at 42.6%, is expected to rise up to 46.6%. This figure is lower than both the current and projected dependency rate in Scotland.

Population in Edinburgh and the top eight largest cities in the UK excluding London

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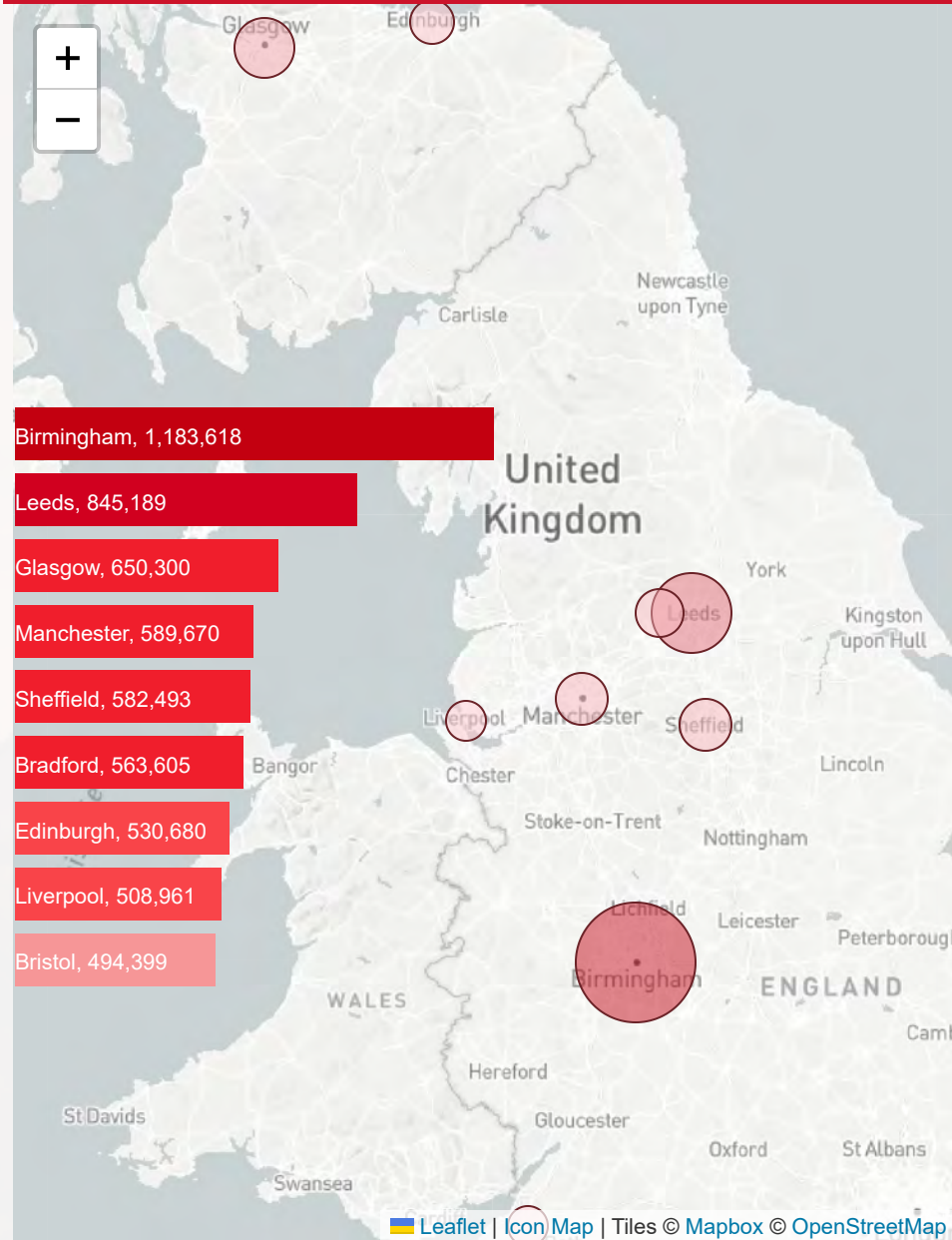
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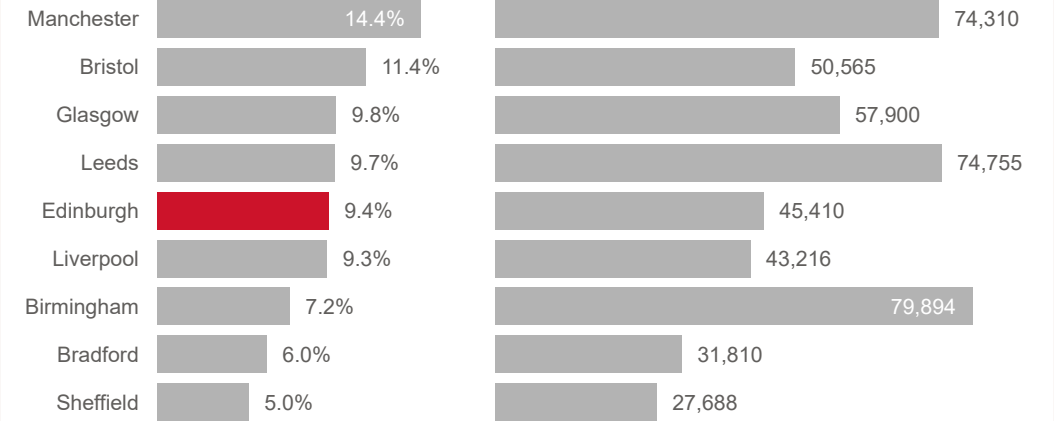
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Population in UK cities in 2024

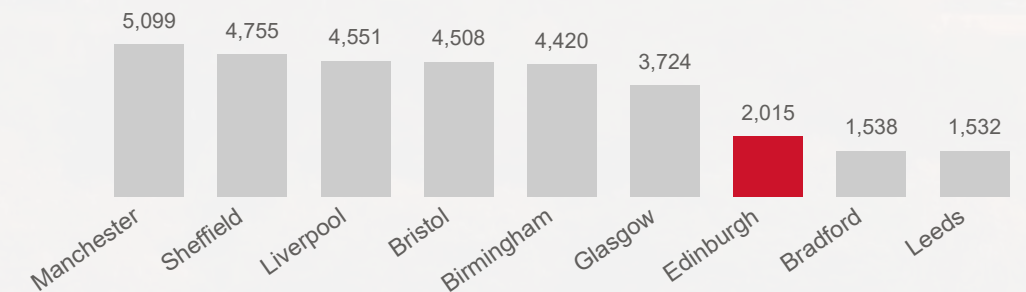
Population change for UK cities, % and number from 2014 to 2024



Key Facts

In 2024 Edinburgh's population density was 2,015 residents per square kilometre. Cities like Bristol, Birmingham, Liverpool, Manchester and Sheffield have over twice the population density level of Edinburgh. Edinburgh's population increase of 9.4% between 2014 to 2024 was the fifth highest in proportional terms behind Manchester, Bristol, Glasgow and Leeds.

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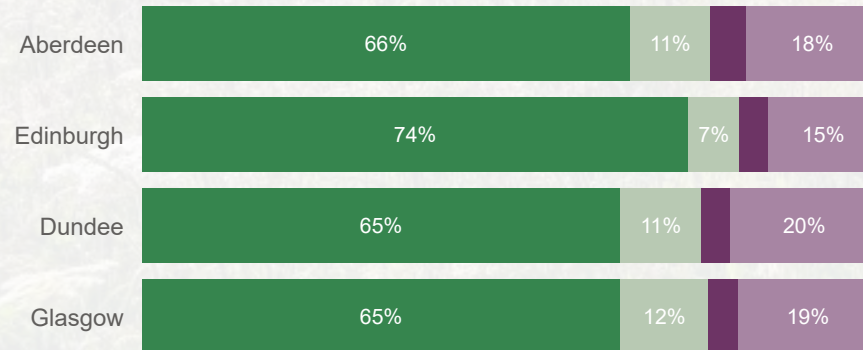

Key Facts

Most people in Edinburgh self-assess their own health as good or very good (81% of the population). During the period 2021-2024 only 15% of people in Edinburgh said that they did very low levels of activity. The percentage of the population in Edinburgh who walk for fitness (76%) is higher than the average for Scotland (71%).

Percentage of population that achieved different levels of activity in main Scottish cities 2021-24

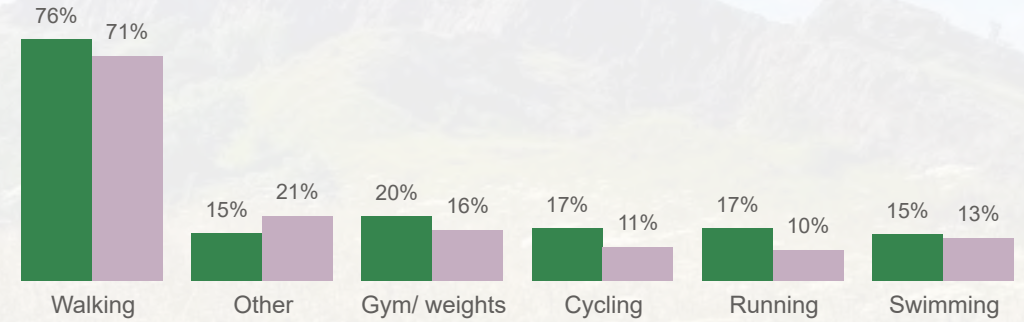

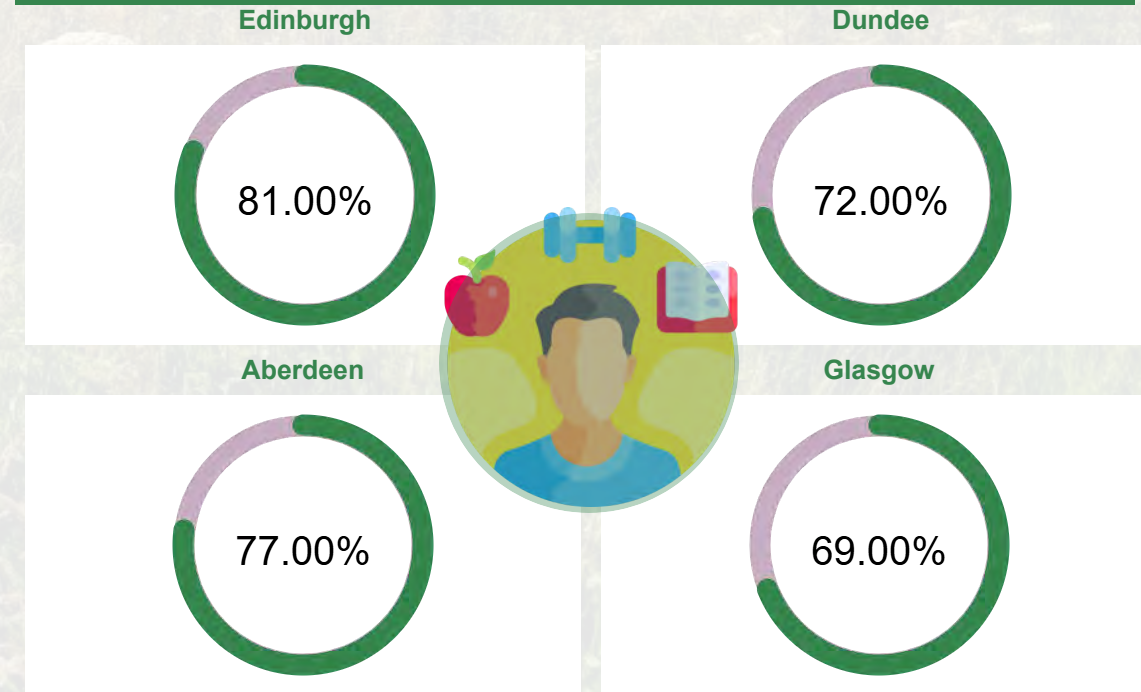

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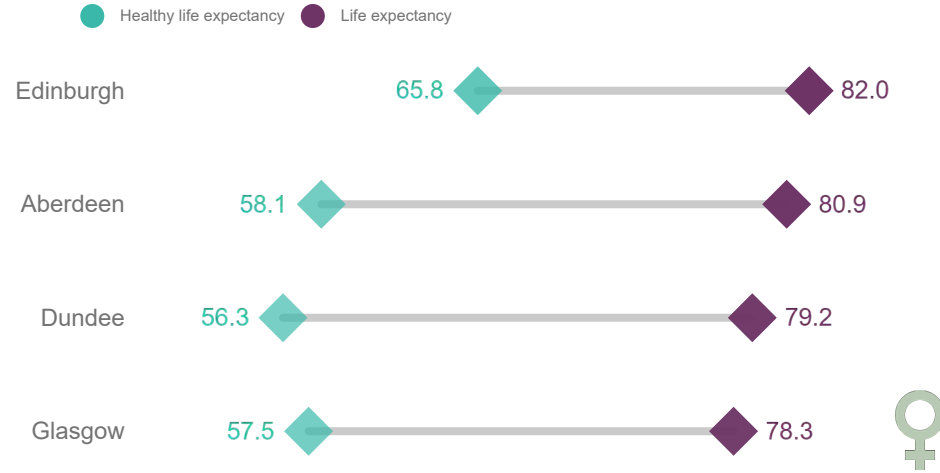

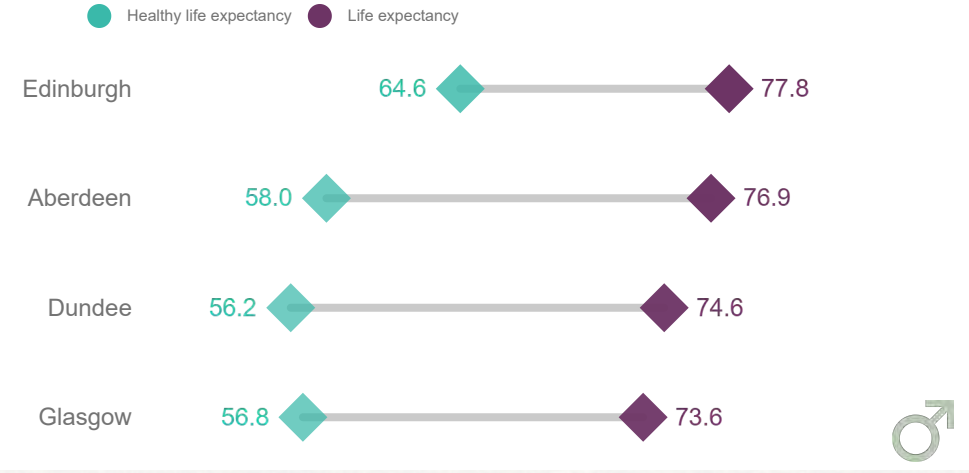

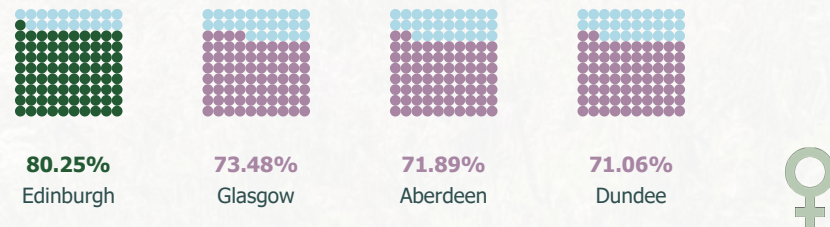
Female life and healthy life expectancy in Scottish Cities 2021-23 (years)



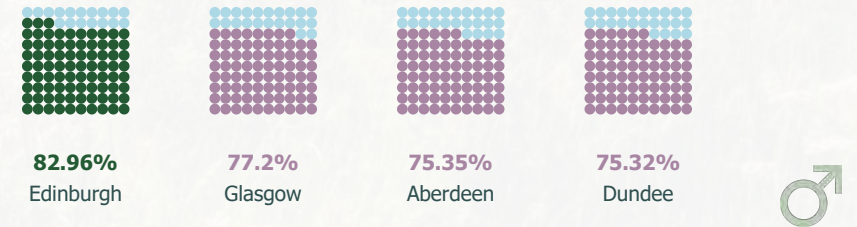
Male life and healthy life expectancy in Scottish Cities 2021-23 (years)

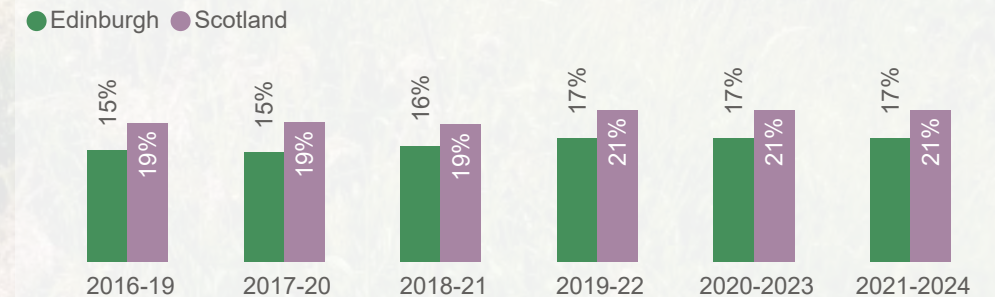
Key Facts

Edinburgh has the highest life expectancy and healthy life expectancy compared with other Scottish cities, with female population expected to live to an average of just over 82 years old and male population to 78 years old. Both male and female population spend an average of around 80% of their lives in good health.

The percentage of people in relative poverty in Edinburgh continues to sit below the Scottish average and has not changed in the last 5 years.

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Economic status of Edinburgh residents and employment compared with other UK cities

Key Facts

The proportion of people in Edinburgh who are economically inactive but want a job is lower than the average of major UK cities at 3.25%. Over four fifths (83.9%) of the population between 16 and 64 years are economically active, which is the highest percentage of the eight main cities in UK. The main reasons for being economically inactive in Edinburgh include being a student (33.5%), being long-term sick (21.6%) and looking after someone (16.2%).

Note: Major UK Cities average is based on the top eight largest populated cities in the UK excluding London, which are: Bradford, Bristol, Birmingham, Glasgow, Leeds, Liverpool, Manchester, and Sheffield. The year refers to the 12 months prior to last June.

Percentage of residents aged 16 to 64 years currently in employment in UK cities in 2025



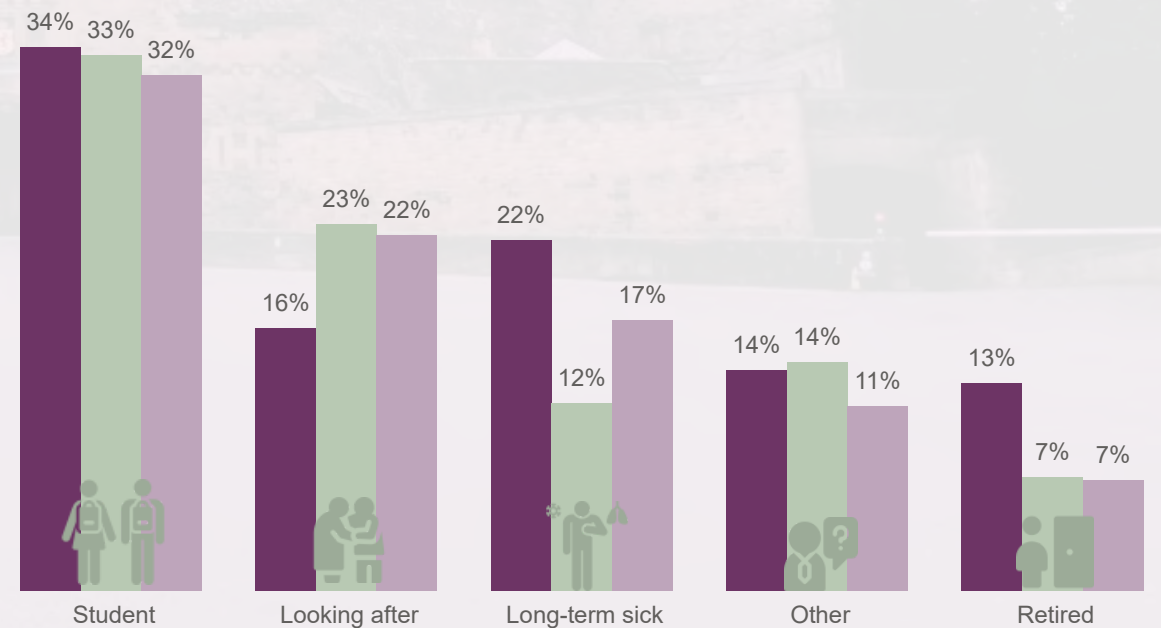
Economic status of residents in Edinburgh and UK cities 2025 (as a % of population aged 16 to 64 years)

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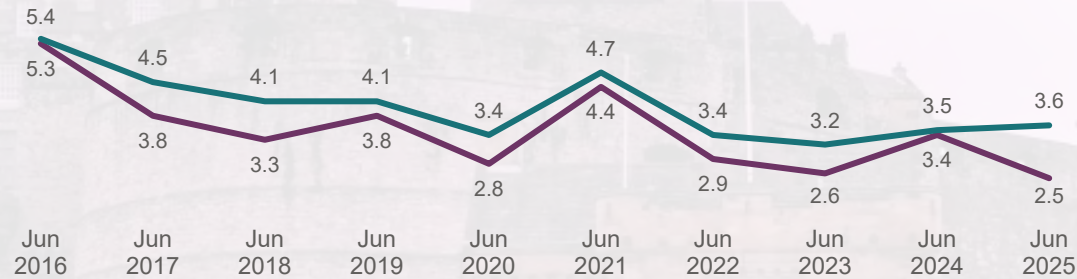

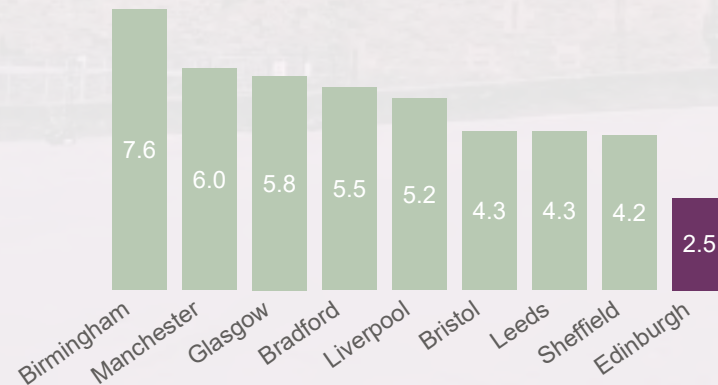
Edinburgh's unemployment rate, at 2.5%, is lower than it has been at any point in the last decade. Ten years ago, the unemployment rate was more than double. The median hourly pay has risen to £20.49 which is the highest of the major UK cities excluding London.

Model based estimate of unemployment in major UK cities in 2025



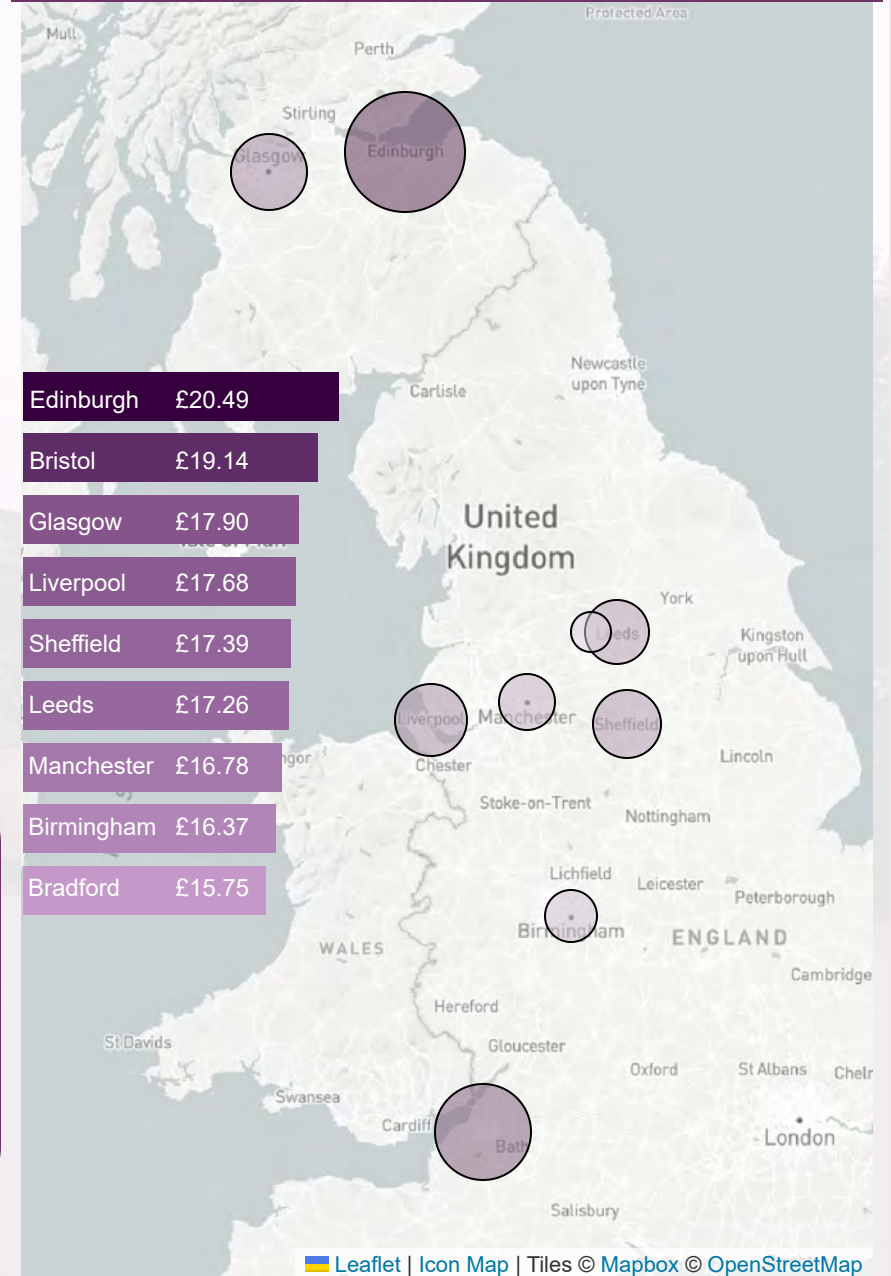
Did you know...?

The median hourly pay has increased 6.1% in Edinburgh from 2024, which is over the Scottish increase of 5.4%. At more than 50% above the UK Real Living Wage of £13.45 for 2025/26, the median hourly rate exceeds the minimum amount calculated by The Resolution Foundation as needed for a decent standard of living.

Median hourly pay per worker in major UK cities 2025





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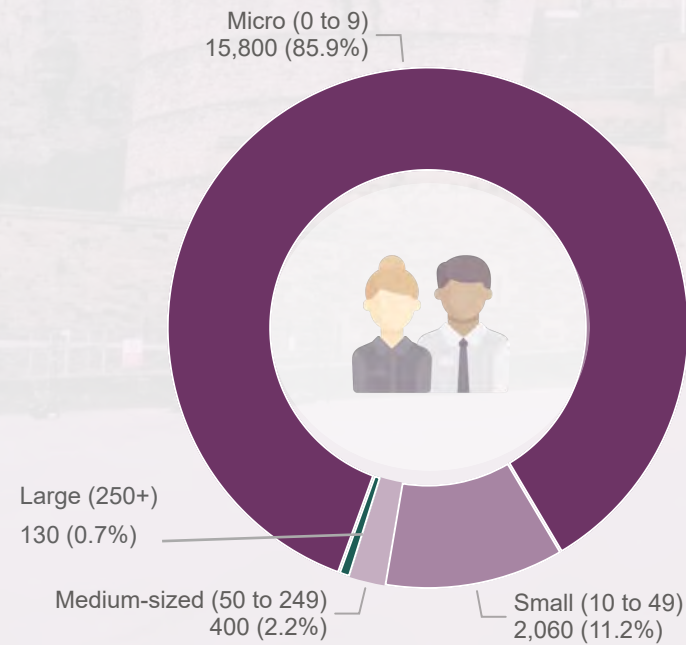

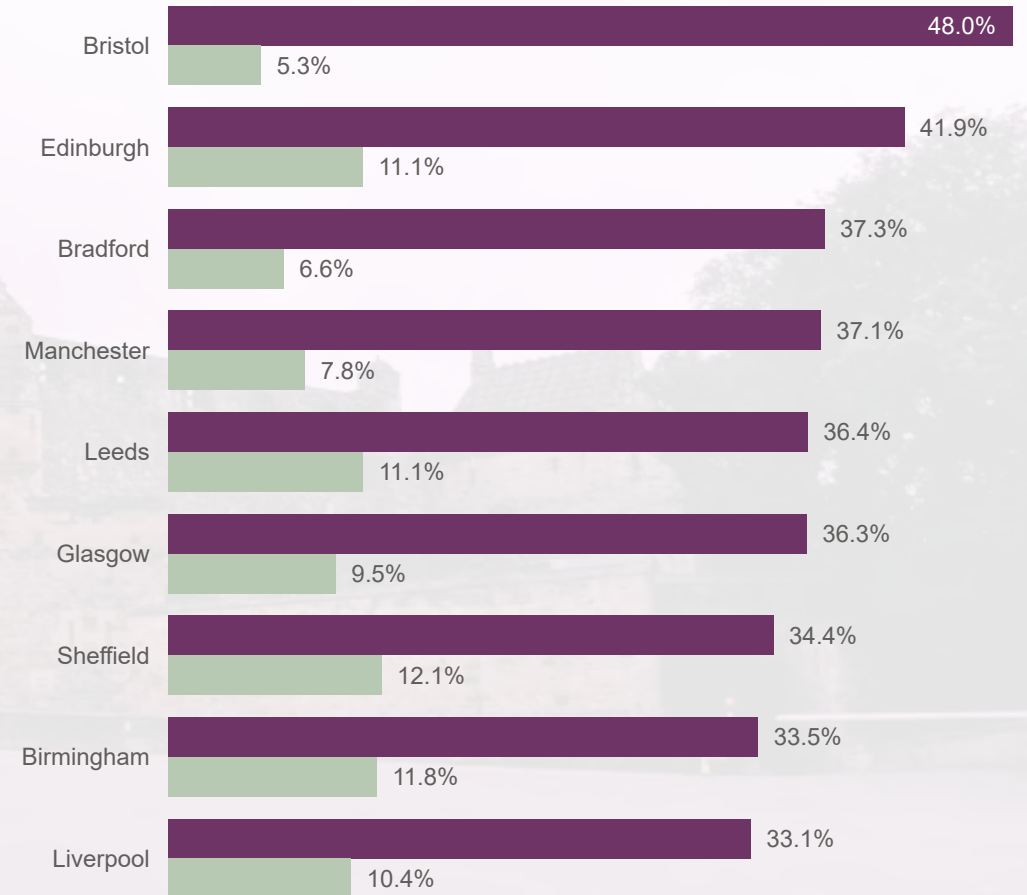
Over 85% of enterprises in Edinburgh are small companies with under 10 employees, while less than 1% are enterprises with 250 or more employees. Edinburgh has a large proportion of workers in high skilled occupations. Nearly half of Edinburgh's workers are in high skilled occupations (42%) while just around 11% work in low skilled occupations.

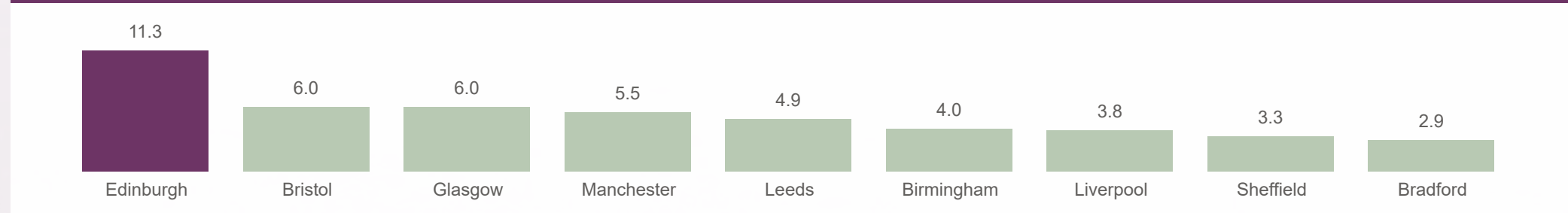

Key Facts

57,000 people in Edinburgh are employed in the health industry. This makes up just over 15% of all jobs in Edinburgh. In 2024, over one in ten people employed in Edinburgh worked in finance and insurance (11.3%). This is more than double the average across other major UK cities. Edinburgh relative to other UK cities has higher employment in accommodation and food services, information and communication and arts, entertainment, recreation and other services but less relative employment in construction and manufacturing.

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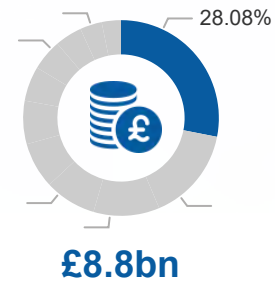

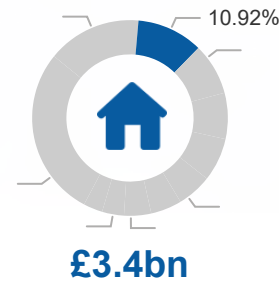

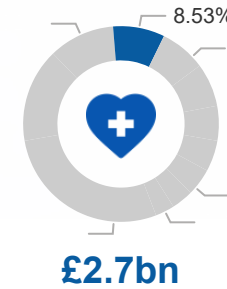

Key Facts

The finance and insurance industry in Edinburgh provides more Gross Value Added (GVA) (£8.8bn) than the next three largest sector combined: real estate activities (£3.4bn), human health and social care (£2.7bn) and education (£2.4bn). In terms of GVA per capita, Edinburgh (£65.5k) has 40% more per person than Glasgow (£46.5k), the next highest Scottish city.

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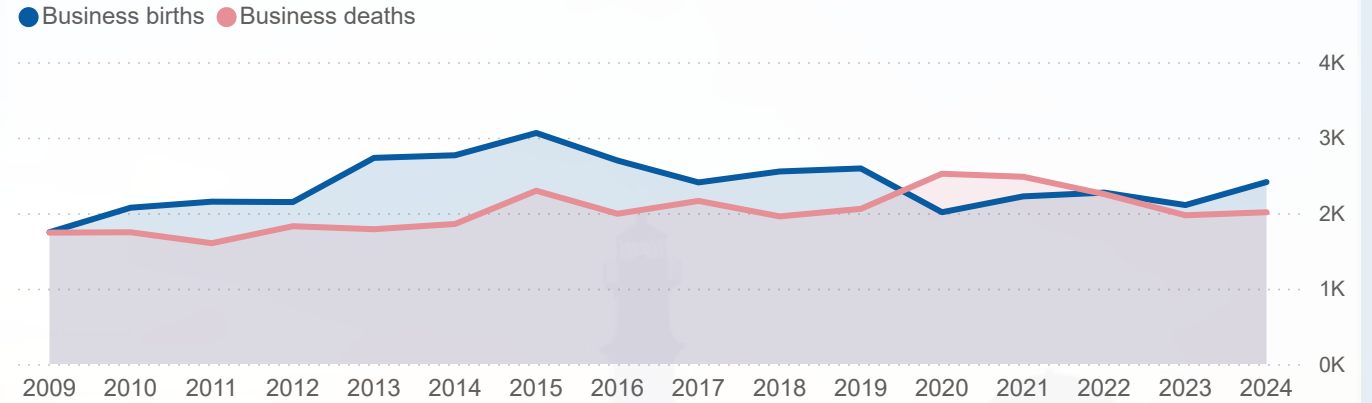

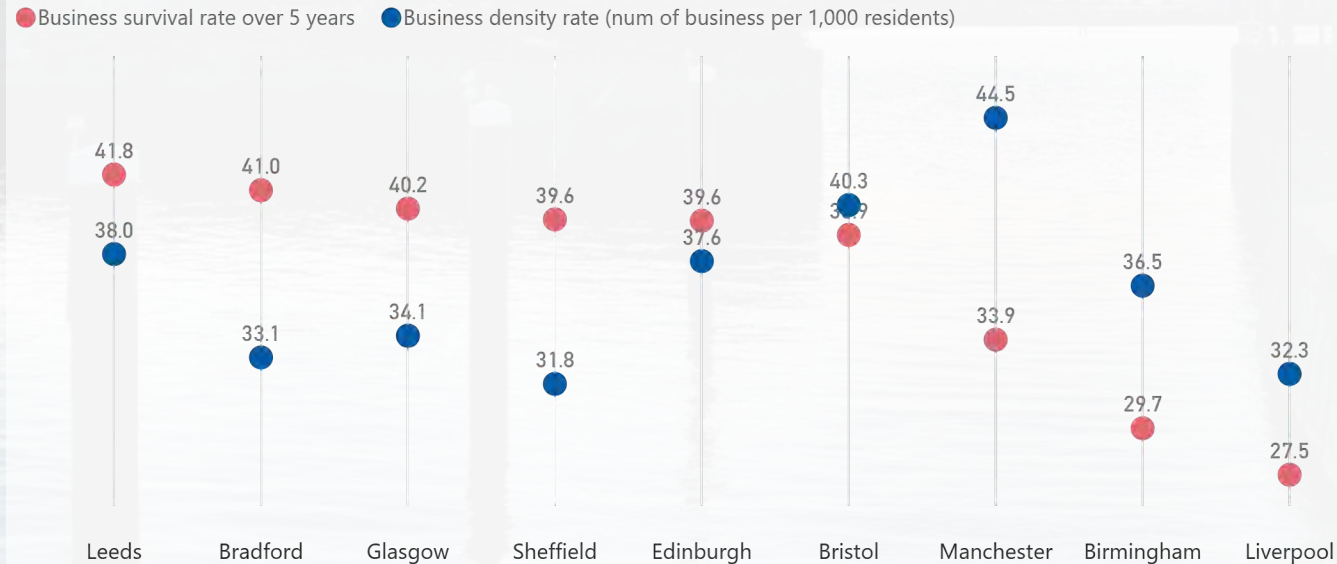
Key Facts

The years 2011-2019 represented a period of growth in the number of businesses in Edinburgh. However, as a likely impact of the pandemic, business deaths overtook births during 2020 and 2021. The trend is changing again, with the number of business deaths returned to being below business births and resulting in a positive business growth. Last year, 39.6% of Edinburgh businesses survived their first 5 years of operation. The period 2022-24 had a 45% reduction in the number of hotel rooms completed from the previous triennium.

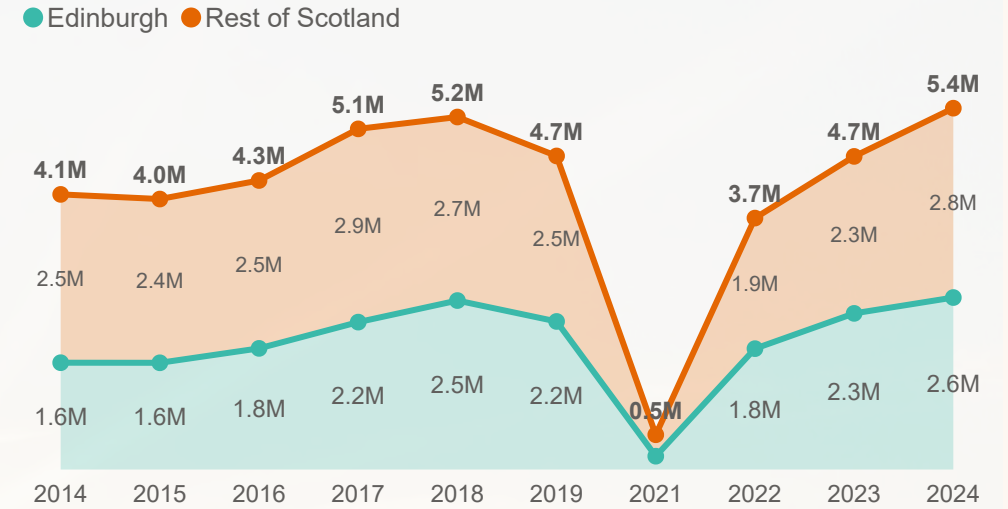

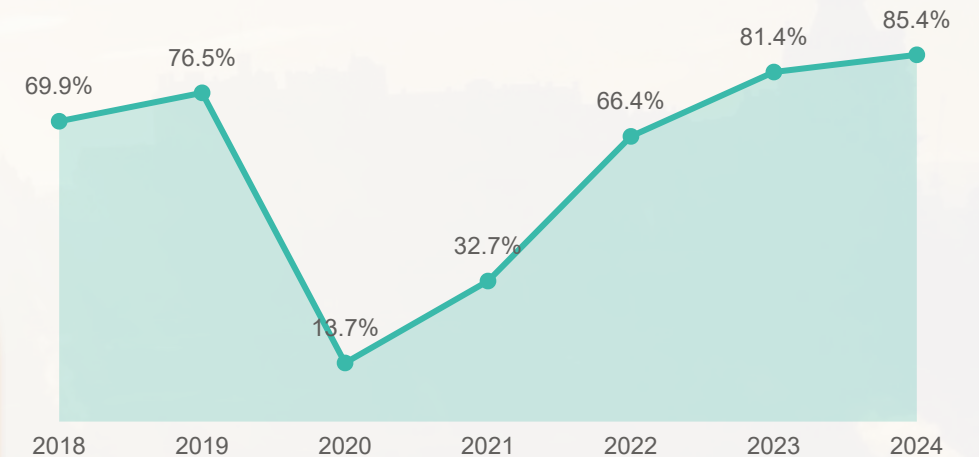
In 2024, Edinburgh continued to see an increase in international visits, and these represent almost 50% of the total of international visits in Scotland. The number of international visits to Edinburgh has increased by 10% in the last year, and although the number of domestic visits has seen a dip, the spend increased more than 24%. Edinburgh reached an occupancy rate of 85.4%, the highest of the last seven years.

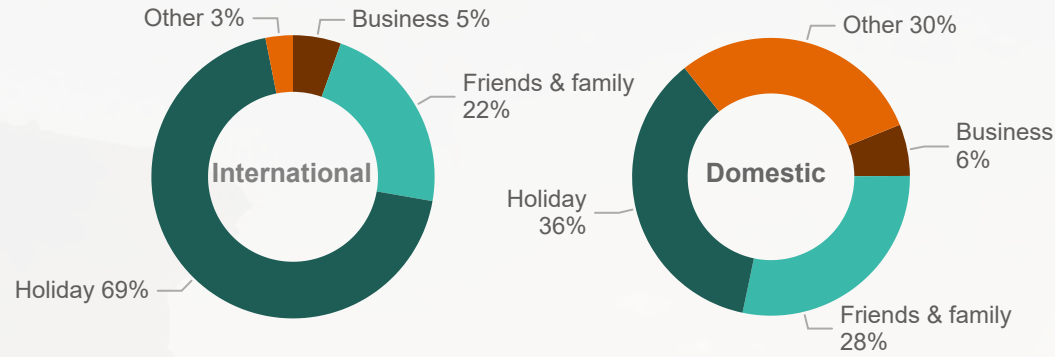

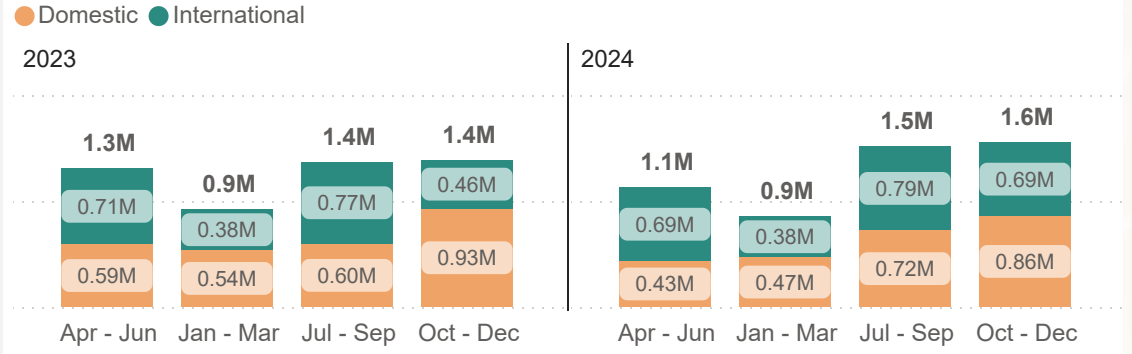
Percentage of staying visits to Edinburgh by purpose in 2024



Nightly spend by purpose for domestic and international visits in 2024



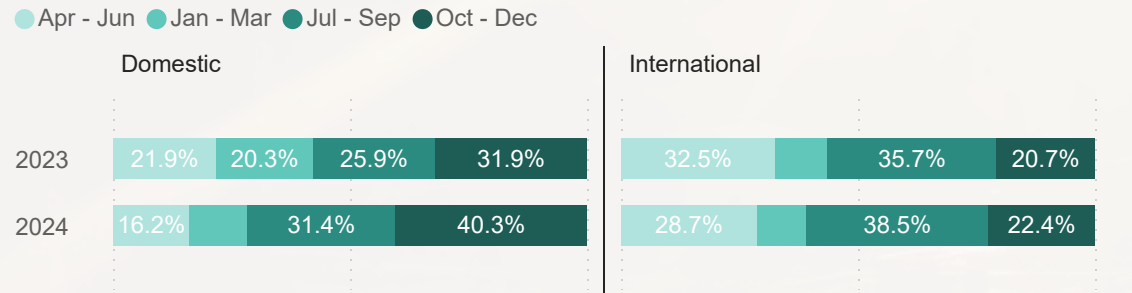
Number of domestic and international visits to Edinburgh by quarter in 2023 and 2024



Key Facts

The primary reason for visiting Edinburgh for both domestic (36% of total visits) and international visitors (69%) is to come on holiday. The quarterly distribution of visitors in 2024 was similar to 2023, with lower numbers in Jan-Mar compared to the other quarters in both years. The highest combined spend still occurs in summer. Domestic business visitors spend the most per night. Most domestic trips (88%) last 1–3 nights, while 40% of international trips last 4–7 days.

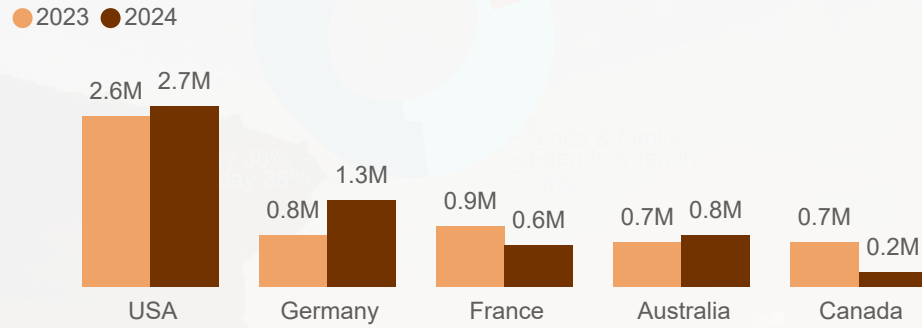

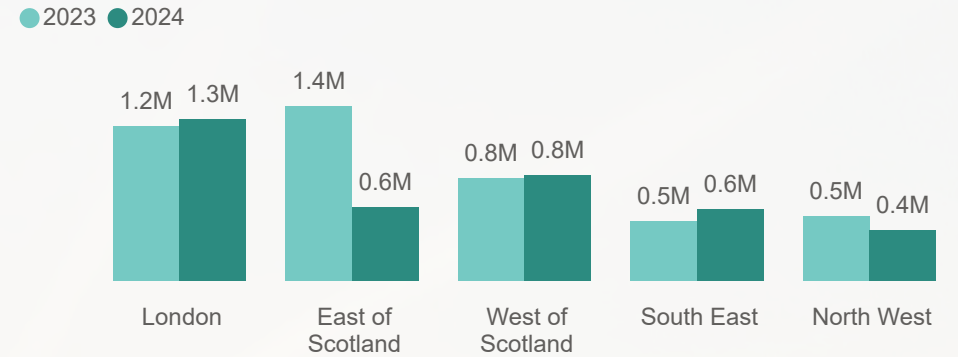

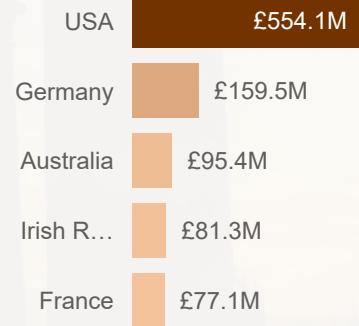
Total nights from international staying visits to Edinburgh by origin (top 5)



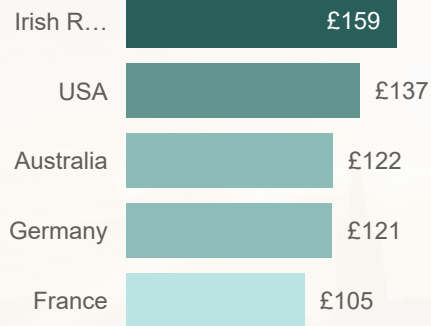
Total nights from domestic staying visits to Edinburgh by origin (top 5)



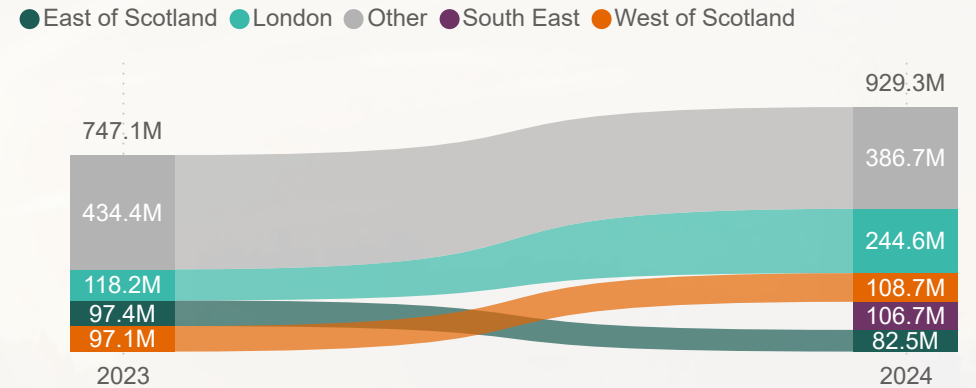

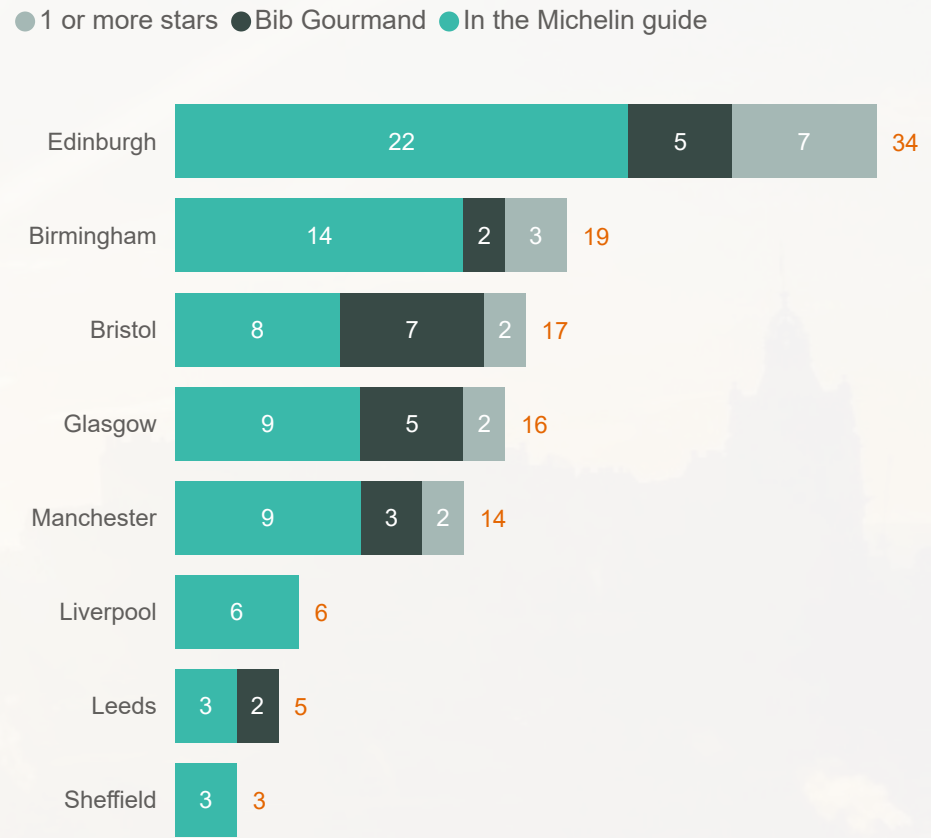
Key Facts

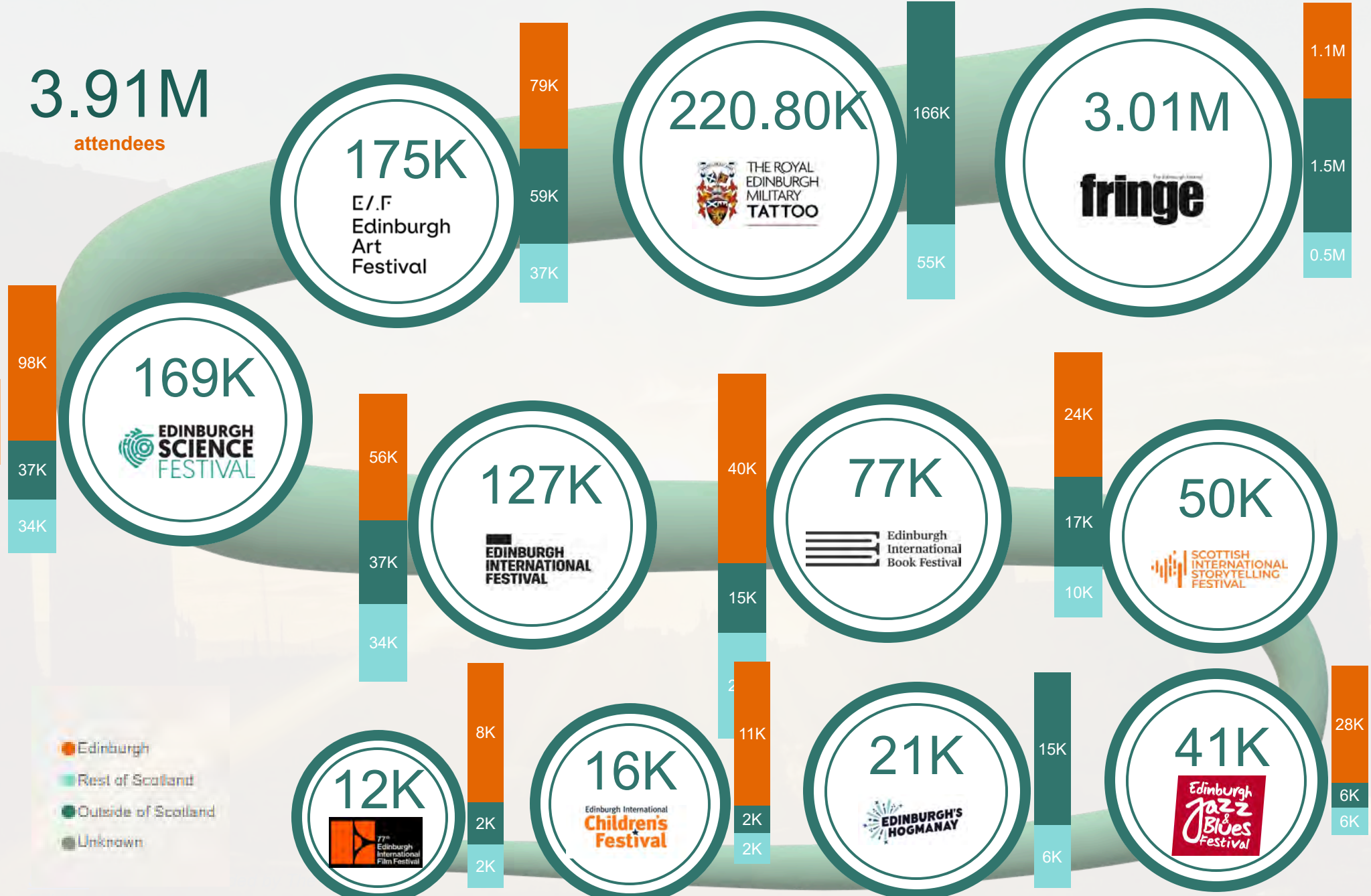
Michelin awarded restaurants in UK cities 2025

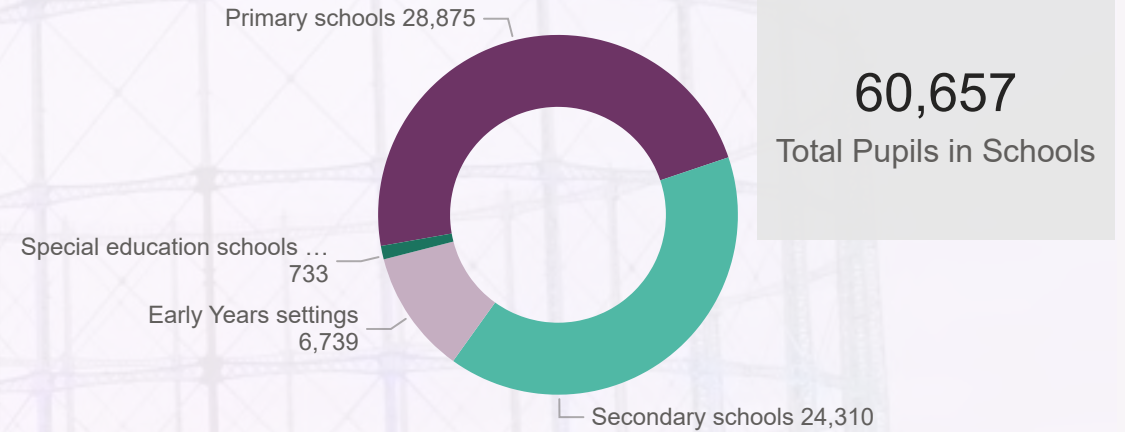

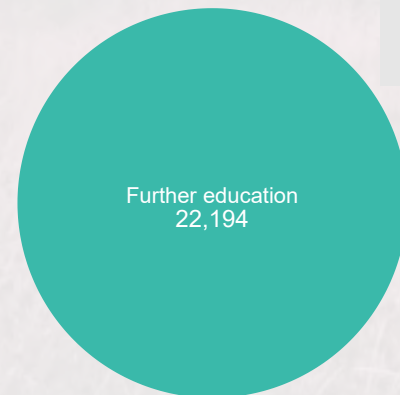

Number of pupils in Edinburgh schools 2025



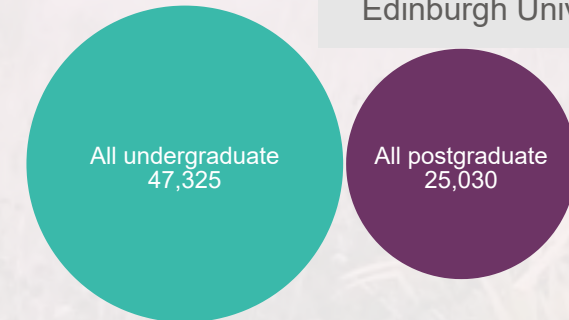

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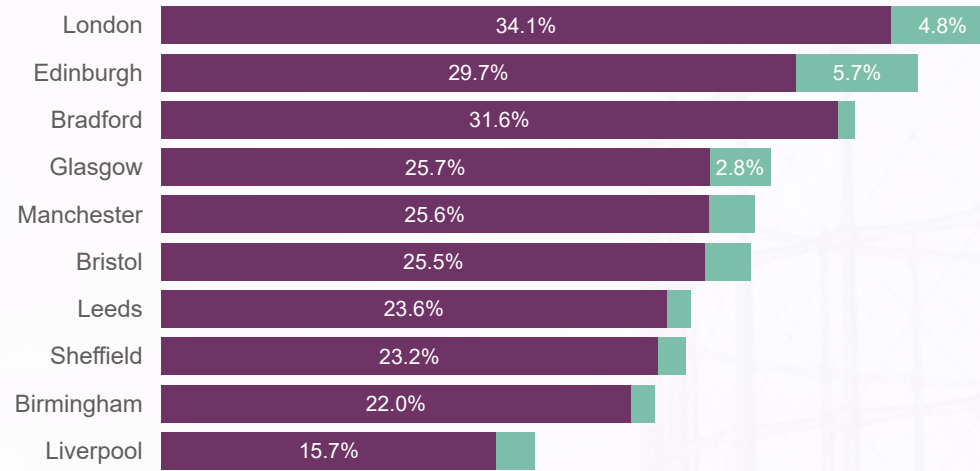

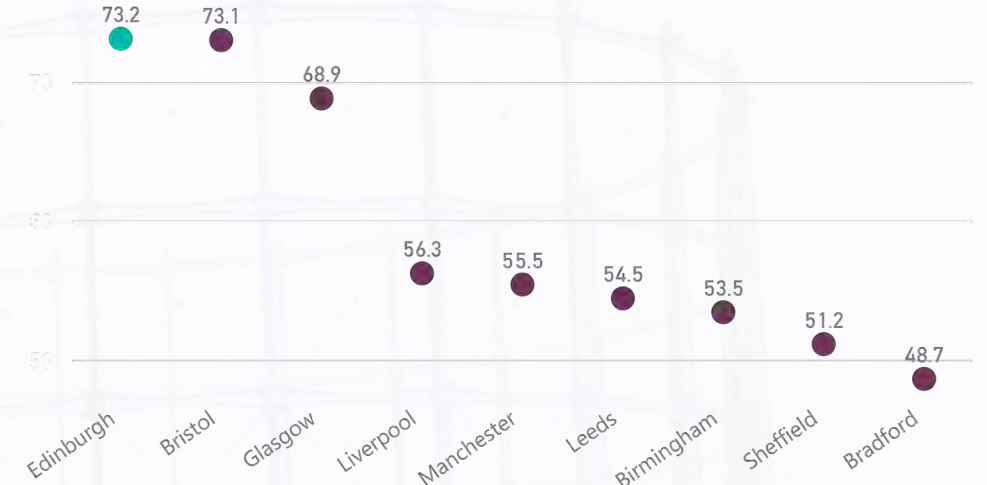

In 2024, 64.6% of higher education students in Edinburgh were from the UK. Compared to other major UK cities, Edinburgh has the second highest proportions of Higher Education students per 1,000 population. 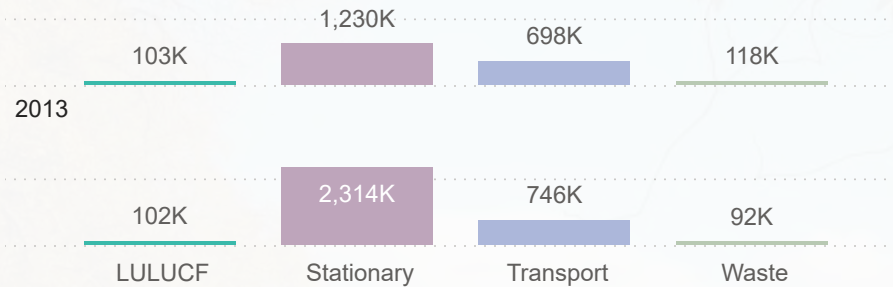

This recognises Edinburgh's strong leadership and transparency in taking climate action, with the Council scoring highly in buildings & heating, planning and land use and waste reduction and food.

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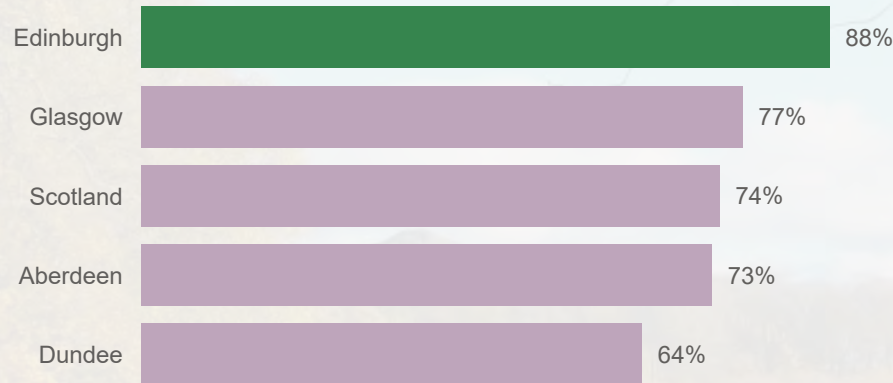

Proportion of people who believe climate change is an immediate and urgent problem 2023*



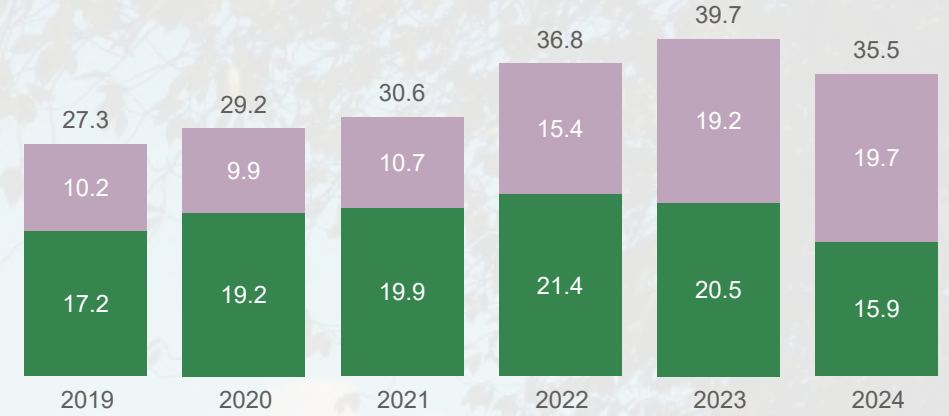

Renewable electricity generation (GWh/ year) in Edinburgh in period 2019-2024

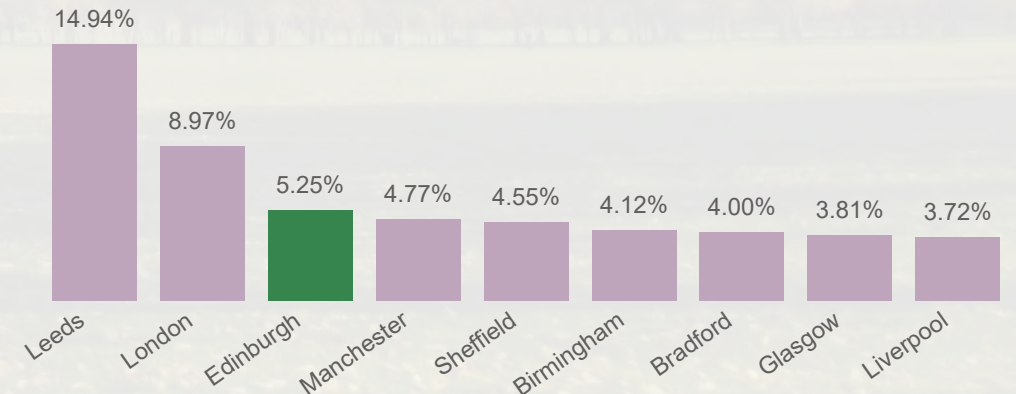

Did you know...?

Lothian Buses currently have 103 electric buses with more on their way. Across city operation, the fleet is now 20% electric.

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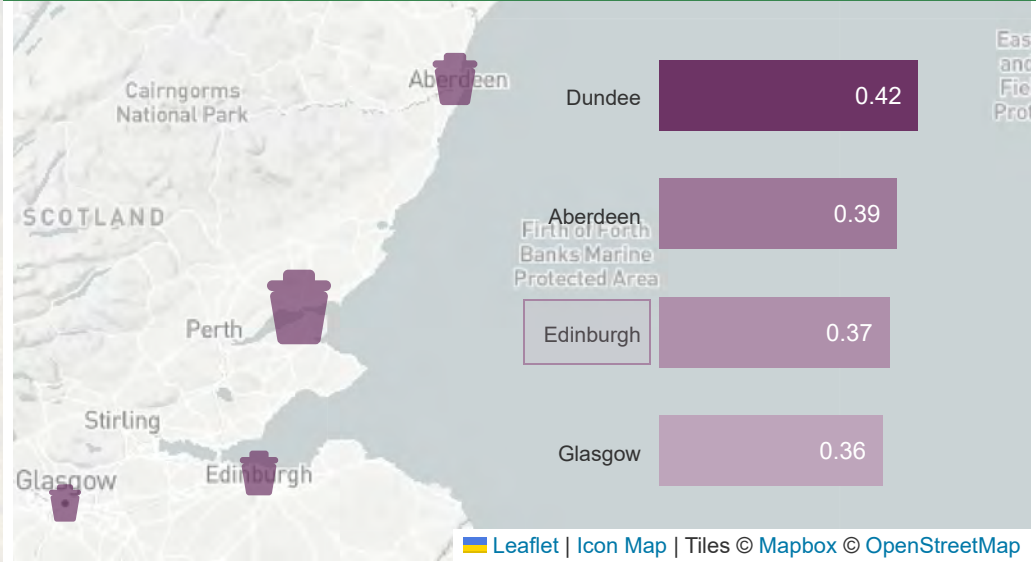

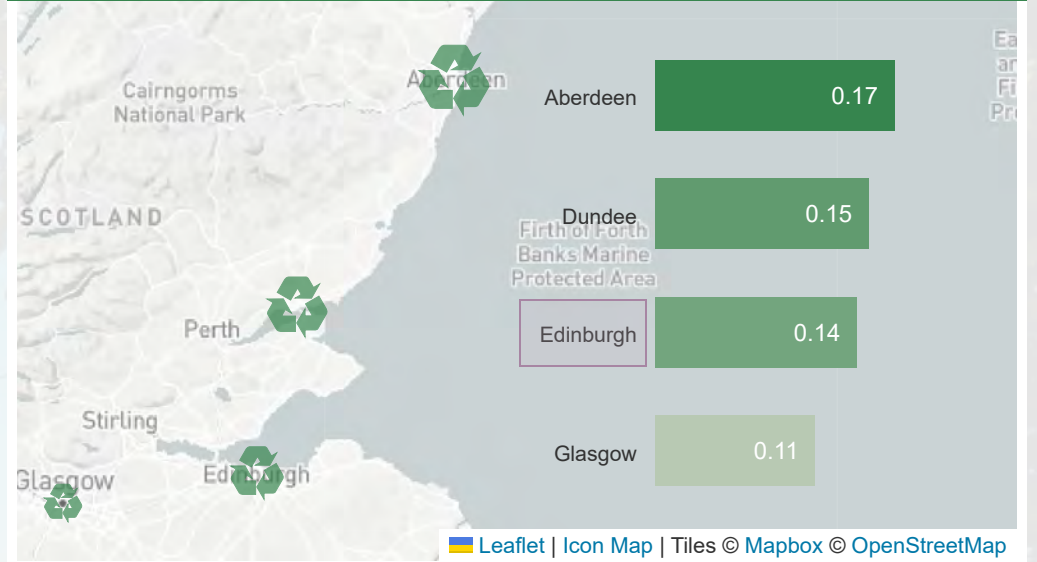

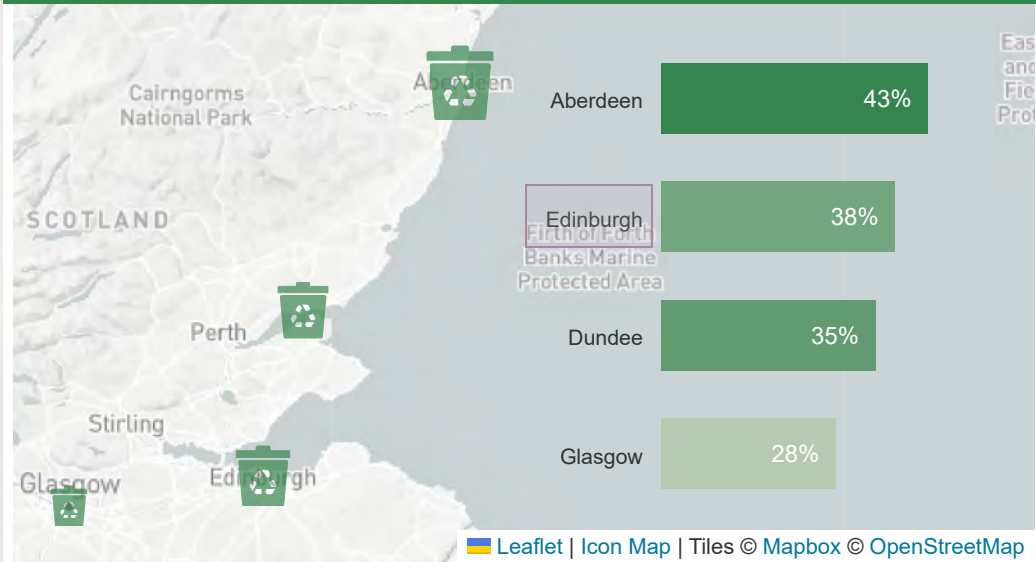
Tonnes of household waste generated per person in Scottish cities 2024



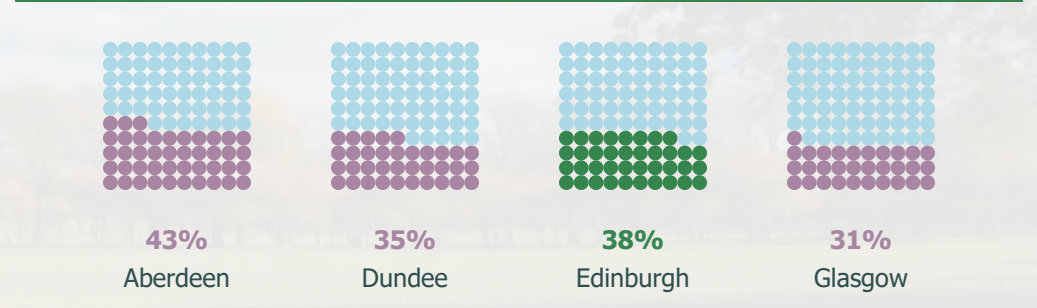
Tonnes of household waste recycled per person in Scottish cities 2024

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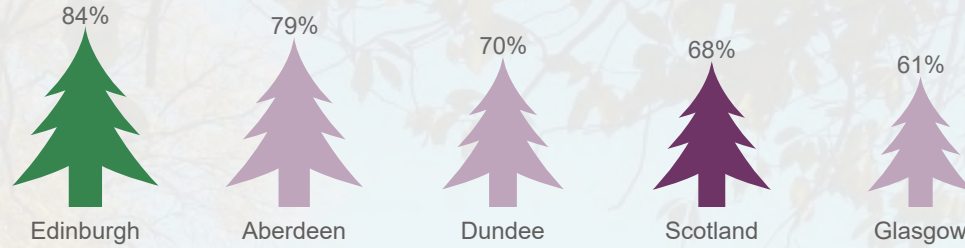

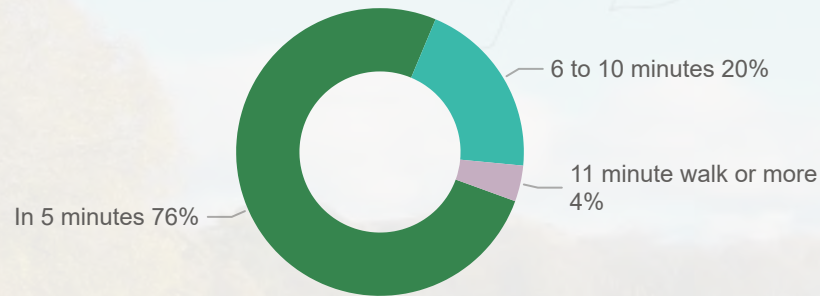

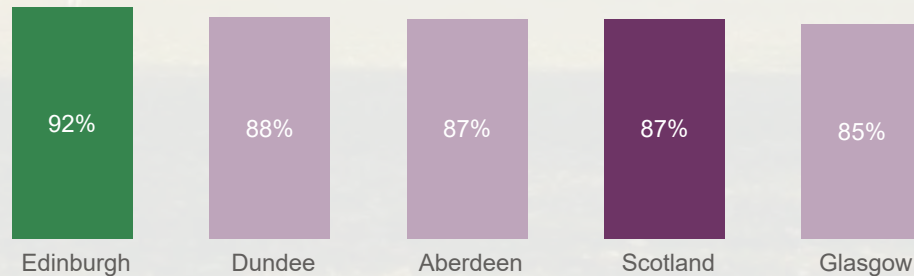
Percentage of population who visits the outdoors once or more times a week 2023*



Walking distance to the nearest green or blue of space for Edinburgh population 2024



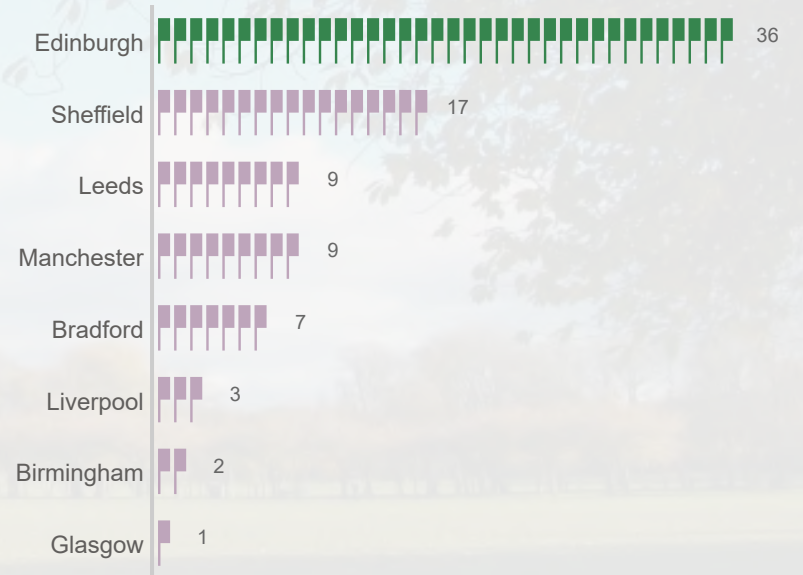
Percentage of population satisfied with their nearest green or blue space 2023*



Key Facts

The Green Flag award is a signifier of well managed parks and open spaces that ensure people have access no matter where they live and the needs of communities are met in the parks. Edinburgh has over twice as many parks with Green Flags as Sheffield, the city with the next highest number of parks with the award. The percentage of population in Edinburgh who visited the outdoors in 2023 is 16% over the Scottish average. With 76% of people having a green or blue space no more than 5 minutes away, 92% of the population are satisfied with these spaces.

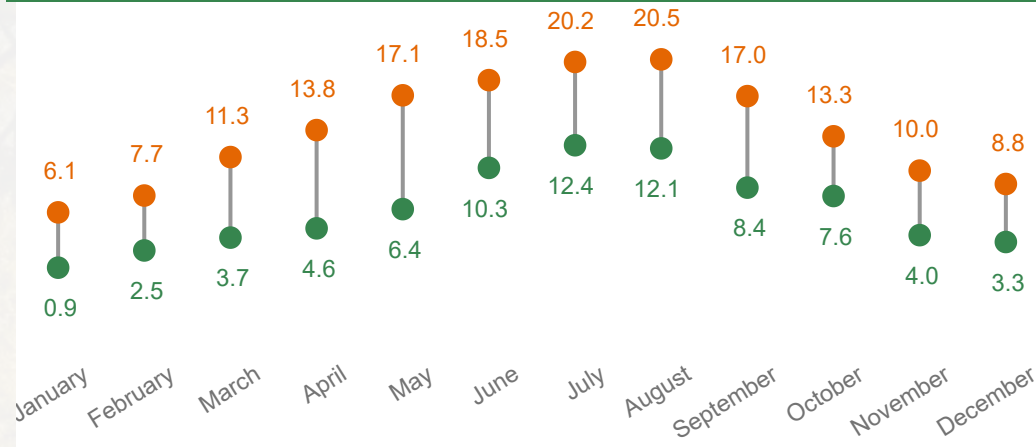

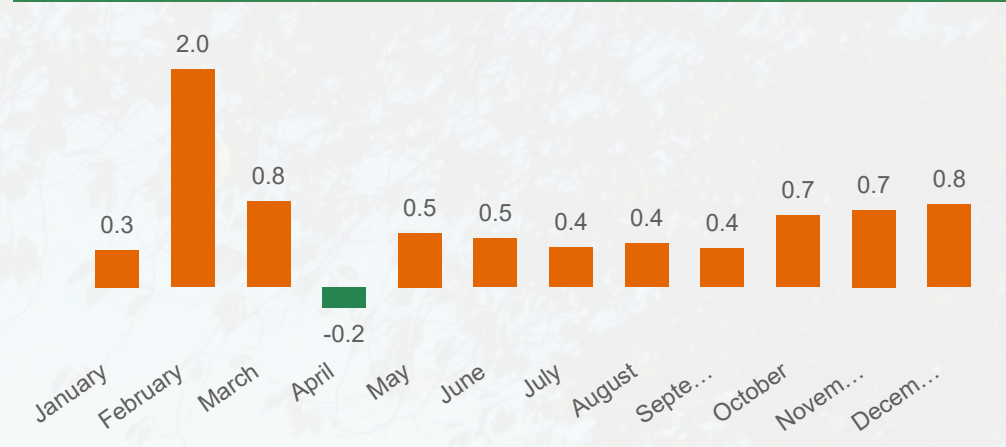

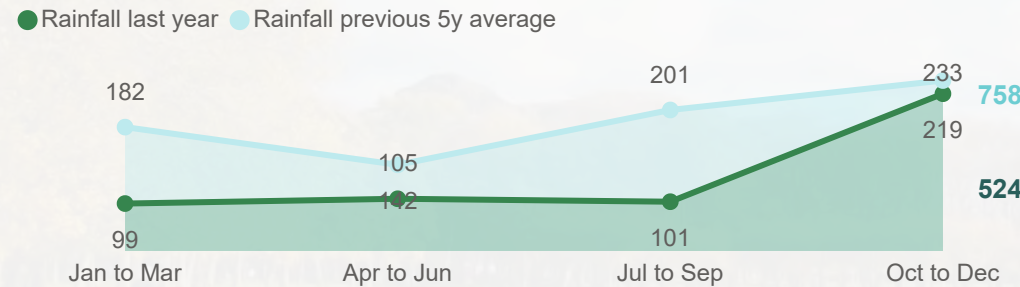
Edinburgh weather, range in average max and min temperature (in Celsius), January 2025 to December 2025



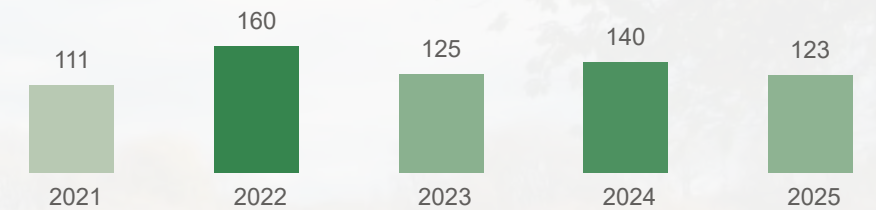
Edinburgh weather, difference between average temperature (in Celsius) in 2021-2025 vs average in period 1961-1990

Key Facts

The average temperature in Edinburgh from 2021-2025 compared with the average from 1961-1990 is the same or higher in almost every month but April, with February increasing by 2C. During 2025 the rainfall went down to 524mm from the average of 750mm during the previous 5 years. Only the quarter from October to December registered a similar amount of rainfall.

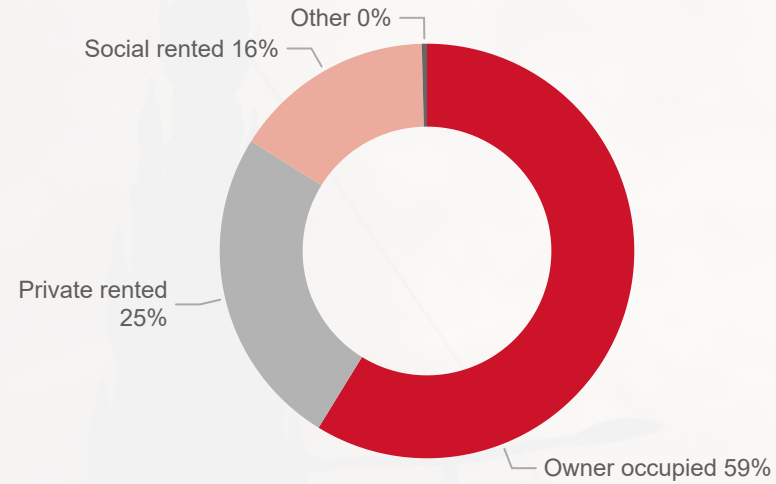

Percentage of households by tenure in Edinburgh 2024

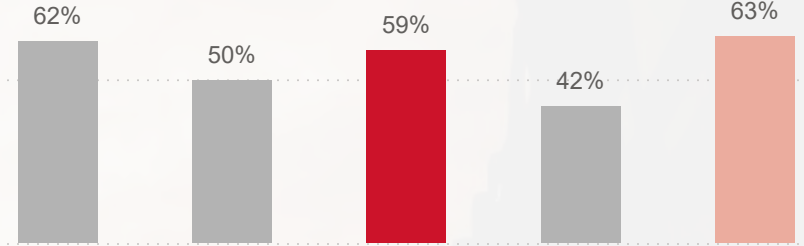

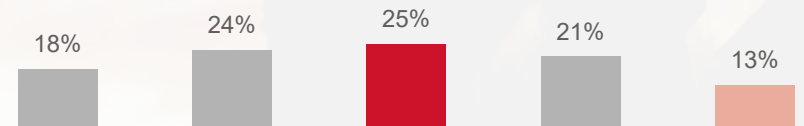
The charts display housing tenure statistics for Edinburgh in 2024, where 59% of households are owner-occupied, 25% are privately rented, and 16% are socially rented. Edinburgh has the second highest percentage of private rentals, almost a quarter of households, and the lowest percentage of social rentals. Housing by tenure in Scottish cities 2024

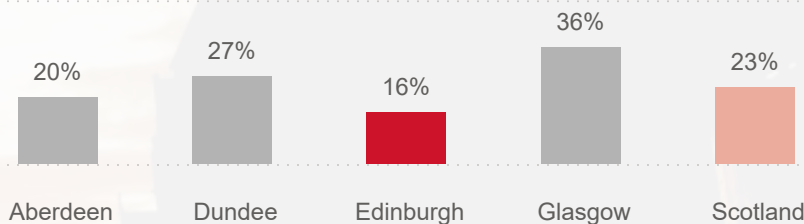

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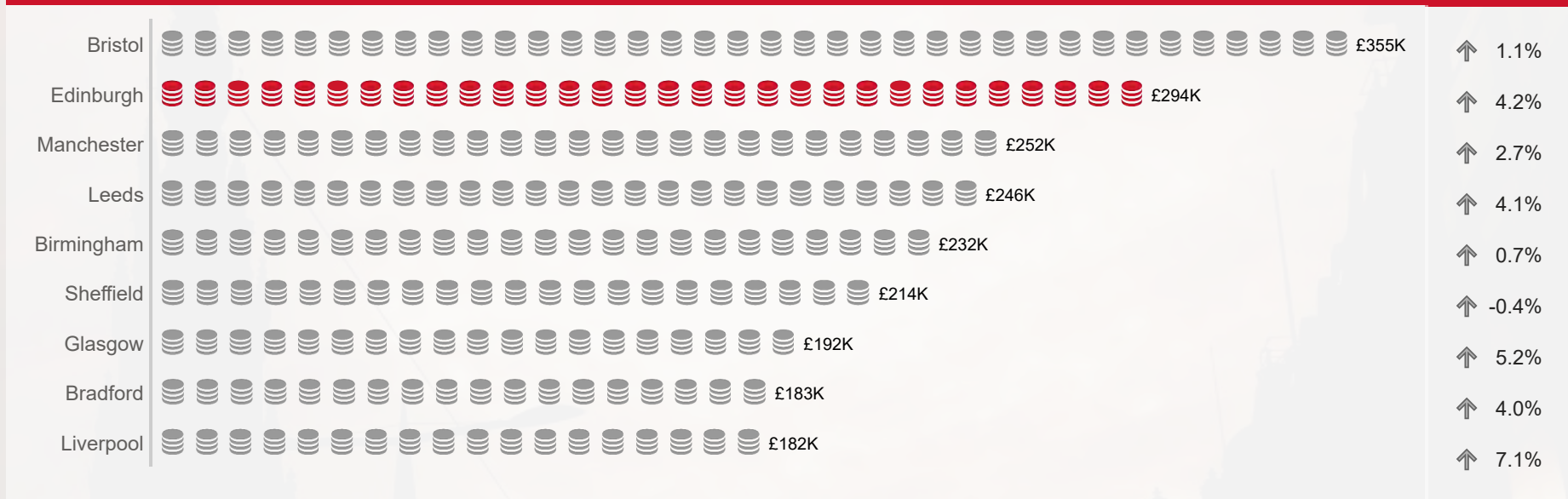

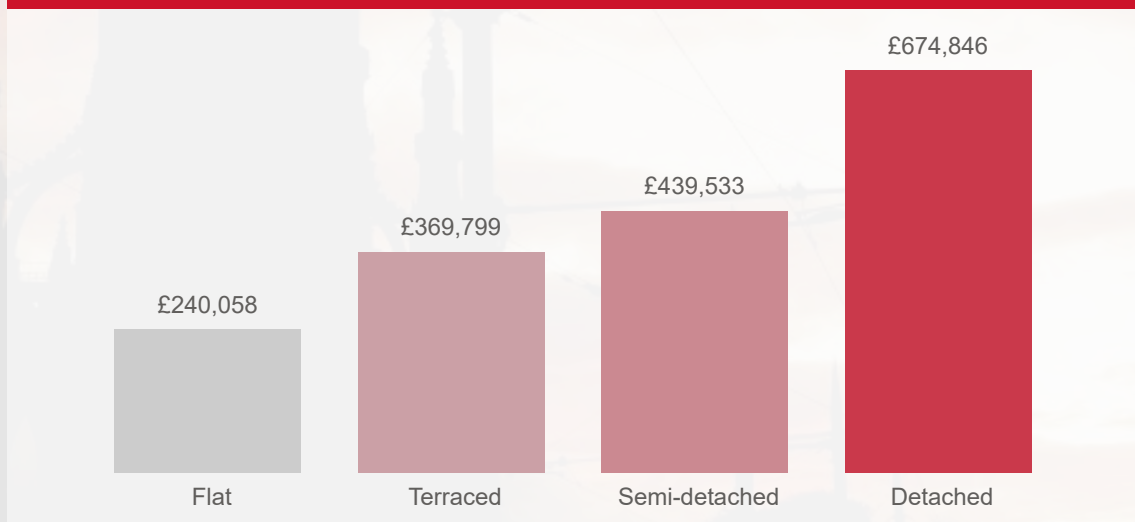

Key Facts

Building types have different average house prices. In Edinburgh the average detached property was sold for £674,846 in September 2025 and the average flat was £240,058.

The average property price in Edinburgh in September 2025 was £294,488 which is higher than the rest of the major UK cities outside London, except for Bristol. The average property price in Edinburgh has increased by 4.2% over the year to September 2025. The growth in prices has slowed down in most UK cities.

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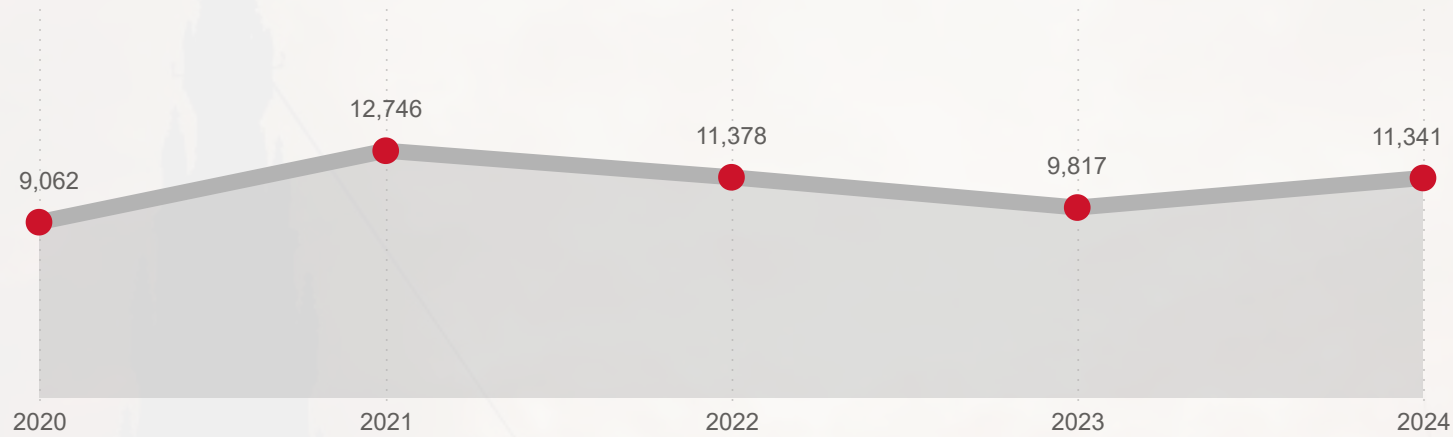

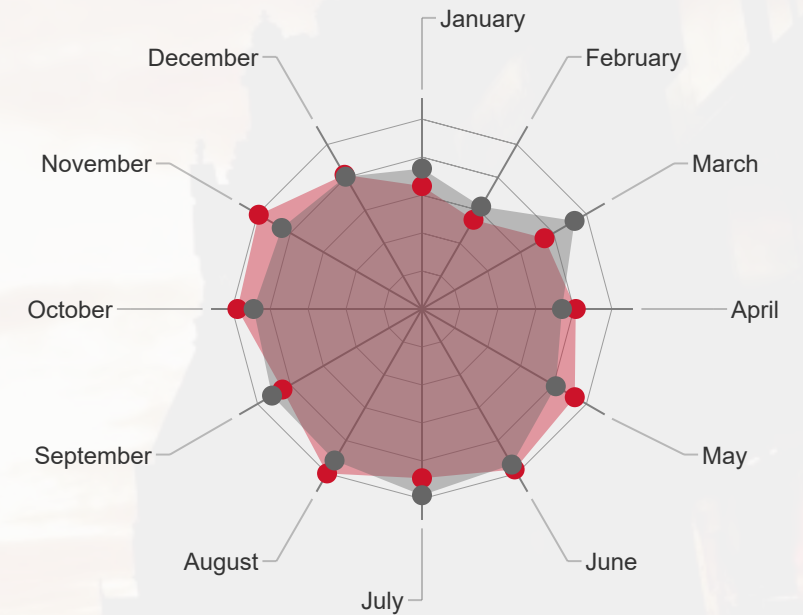
House sales in Edinburgh by month 2024 vs average 2021-23

House sales experienced a significant decline during the pandemic, dropping to just over 9,000 transactions in 2020. While the market rebounded in 2021, sales trended downward for a few years. It went up again in 2024, reaching 11,341 transactions.

Compared with the average of 2021-2023, sales in 2024 spiked during spring and autumn months, which accounted for the highest number of transactions.

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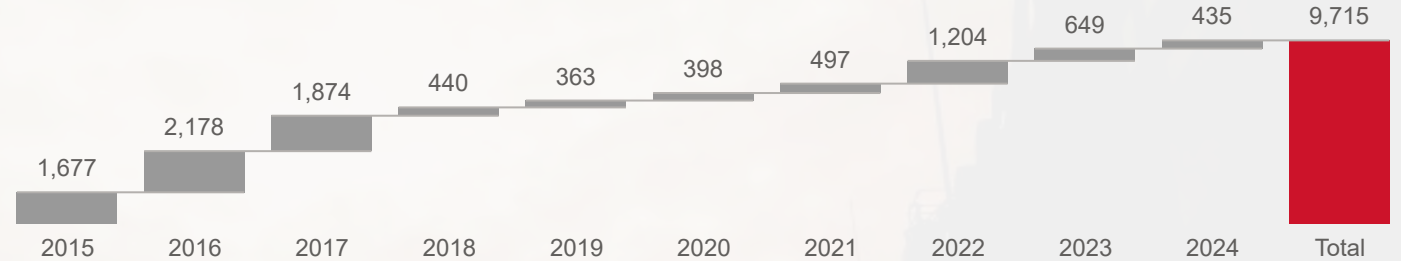

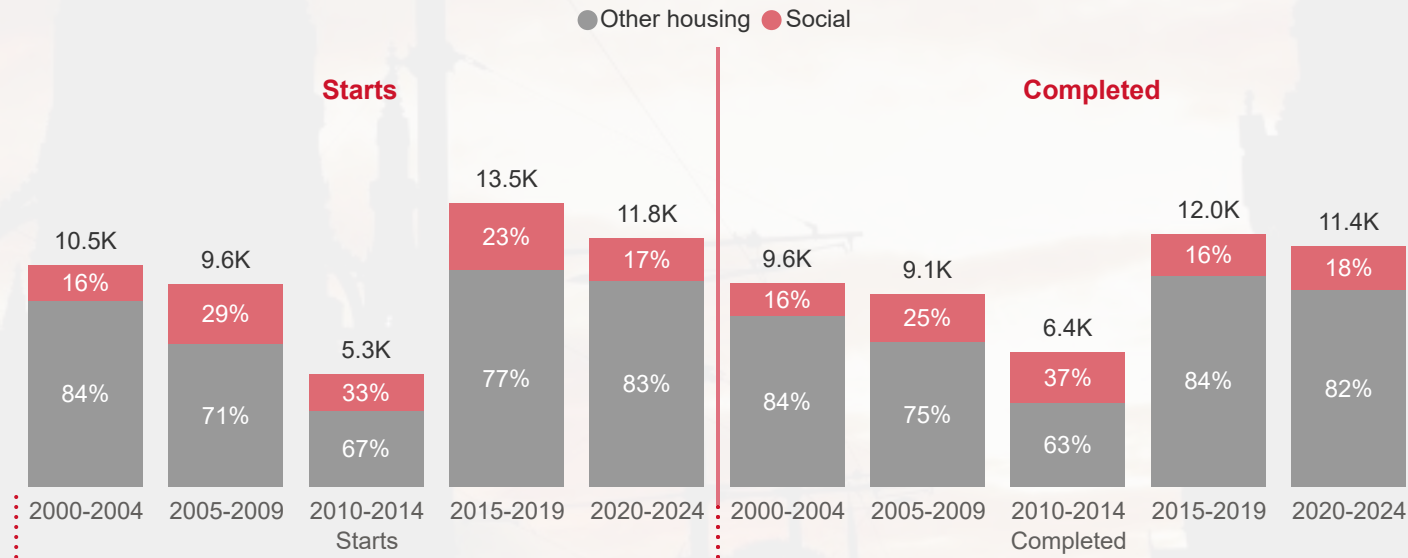

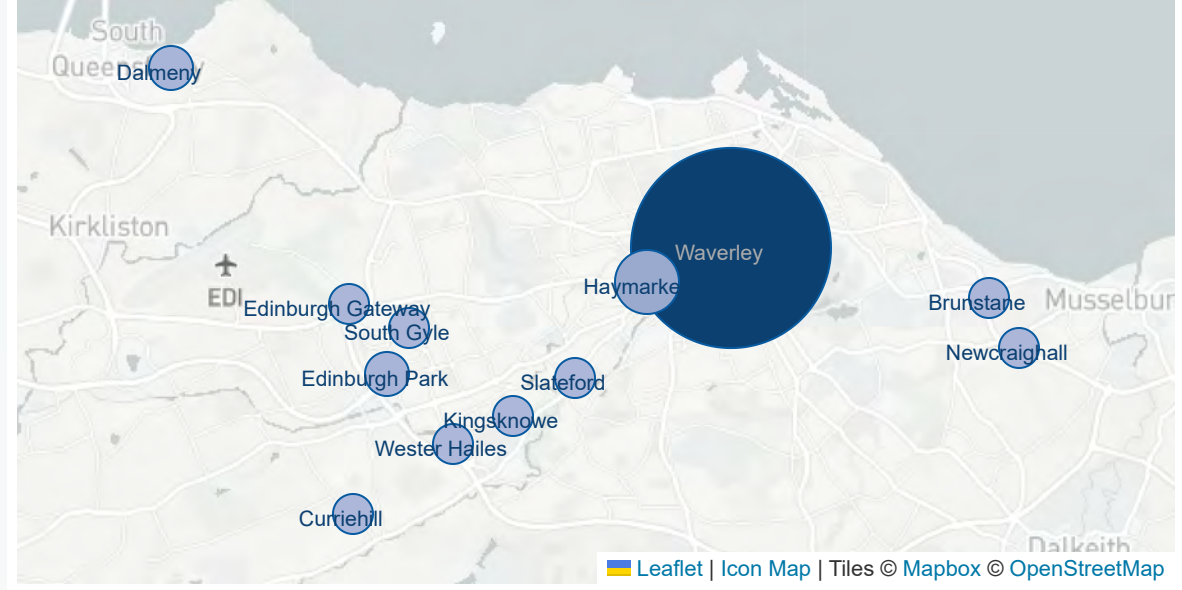

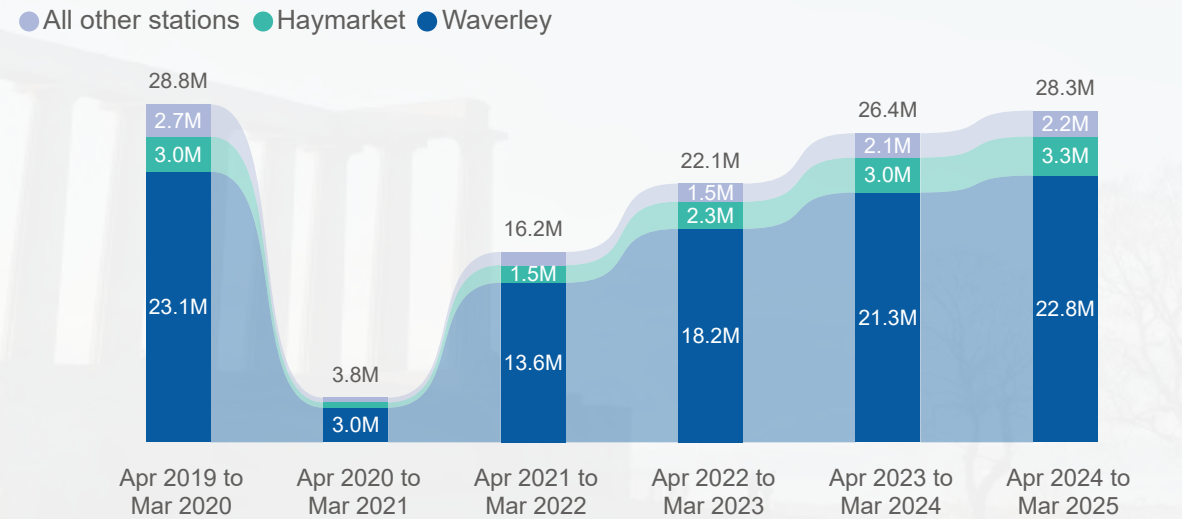

Key Facts

The number of rail passengers travelling to and from Edinburgh fell in 2020/21 to less than 4 million passengers from almost 29 million the previous year. Passenger numbers continue to grow and have nearly recovered, reaching 28.3 million passengers in 2024/25. Train continues to be a quicker option than the car from Edinburgh to other major cities in UK.

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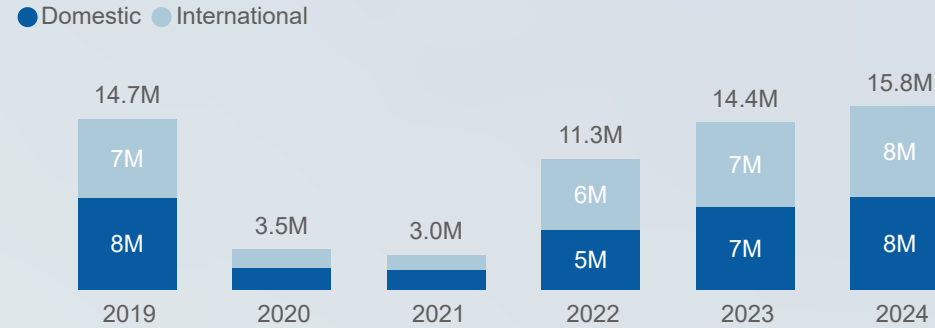

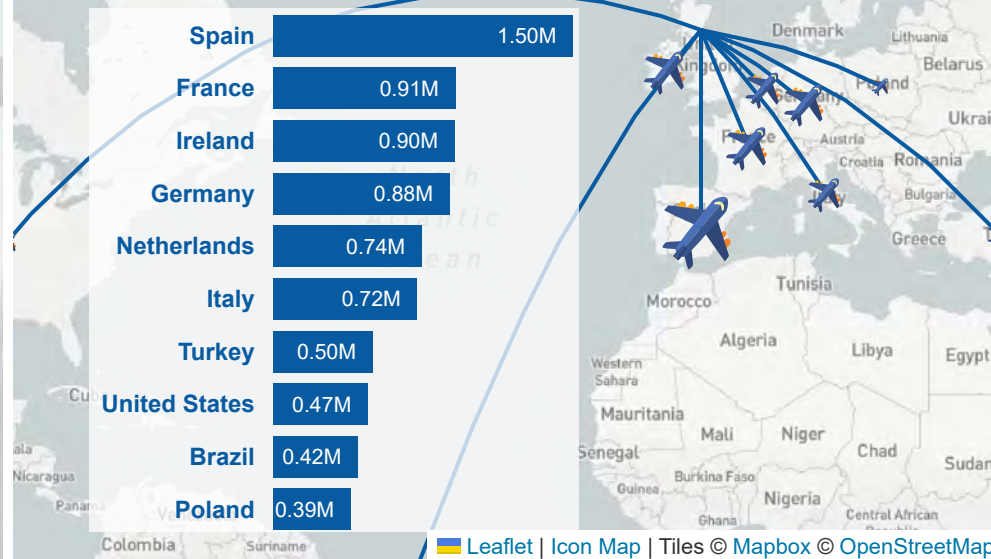
Passenger numbers (millions) Edinburgh airport 2019 to 2024

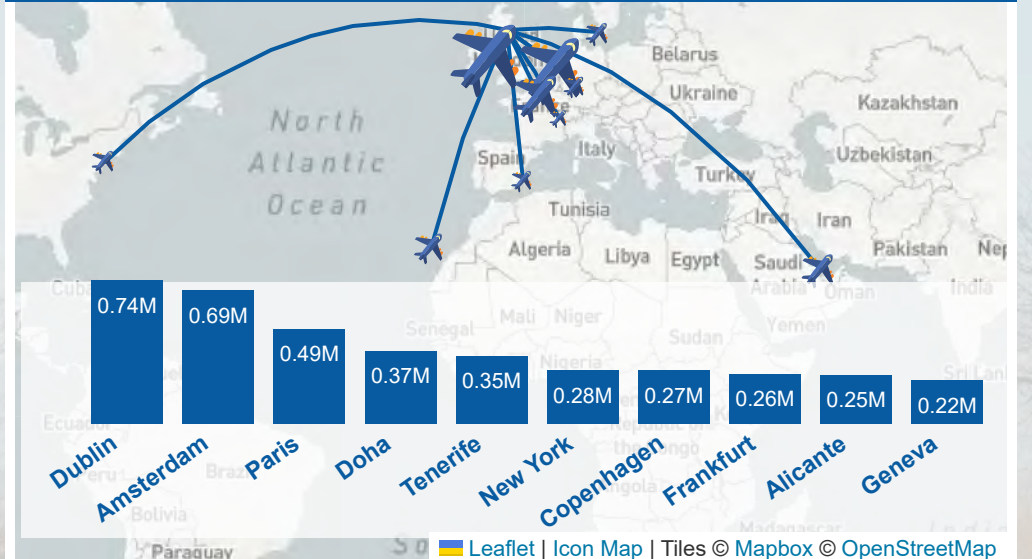
Top ten international countries from Edinburgh Airport by passenger numbers 2024

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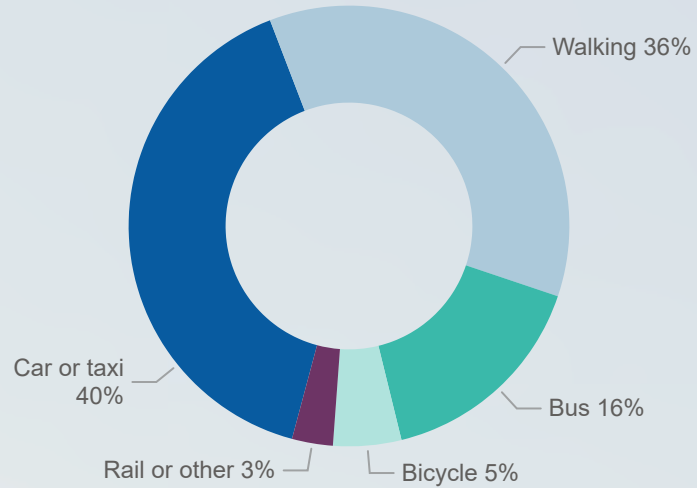

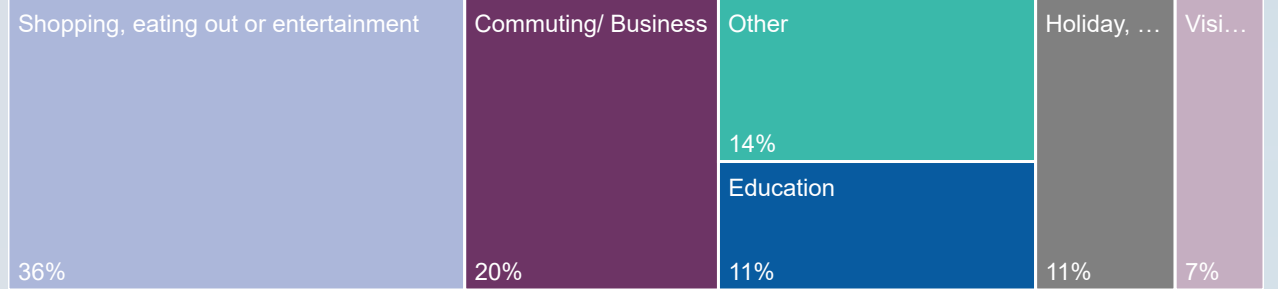

Main mode of travel in Edinburgh 2024



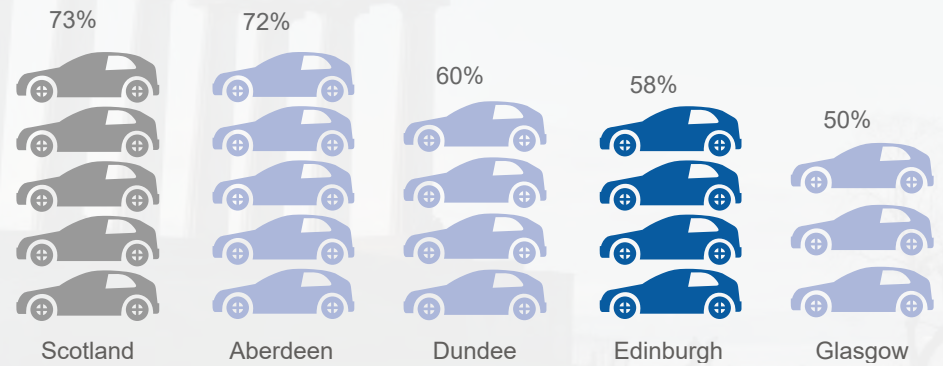
Main purpose of travel in Edinburgh 2024



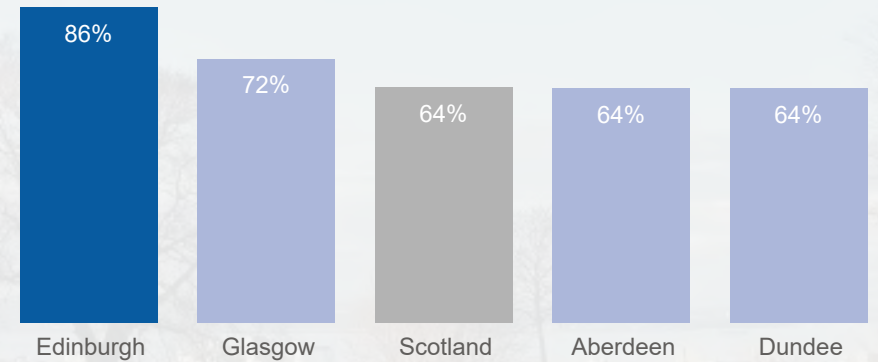

In 2024, around 60% of Edinburgh's travel involved walking or public transport, with leisure activities as the primary purpose in 36% of the trips. Public transport satisfaction stood at 86%, more than 20% over the Scottish average. Despite this good use of sustainable travel, 58% of households owned at least one car.

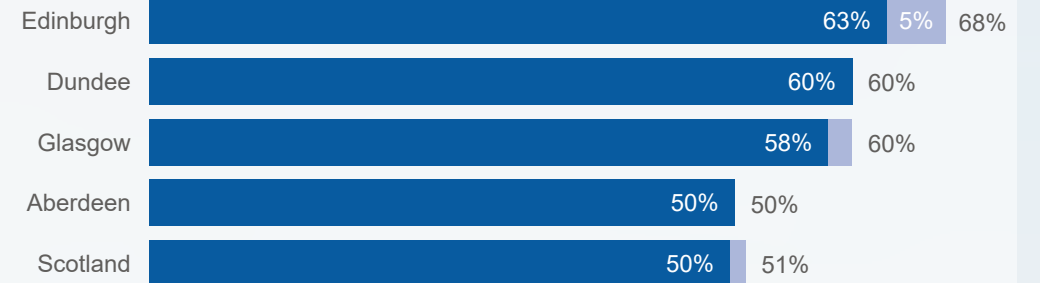

Key Facts

Almost 70% of the short trips made by people in Edinburgh in 2024 were either cycling or walking. A large proportion of residents (65%) walk between 3 and 5 days every week, just over half of them walk as a method of transport but the rest (28%) do it for pleasure. Of the people who walk almost every day of the week, more than half do it for pleasure. 36% of the households in Edinburgh own at least one bike, which sits just over the Scottish average.

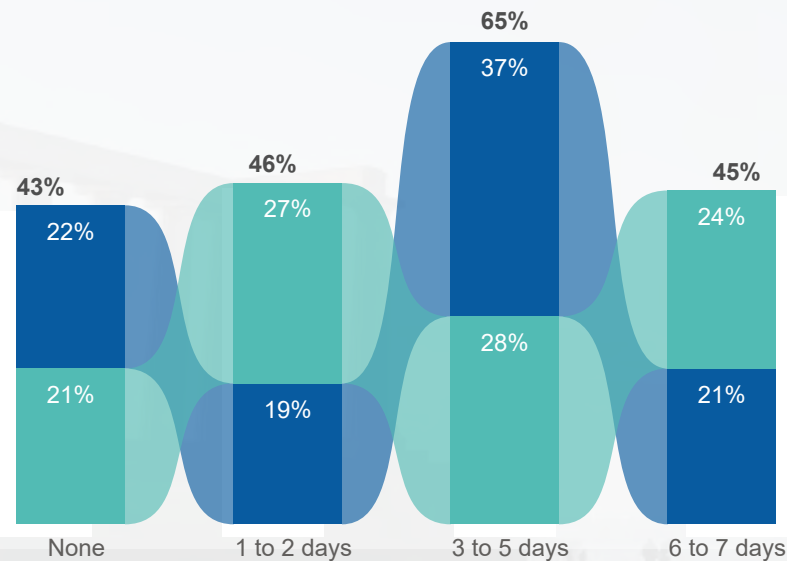
Proportion of short journeys that are made walking or cycling in Scottish cities 2024

● % of journeys under 2mi walking ● % of journeys under 2mi cycling

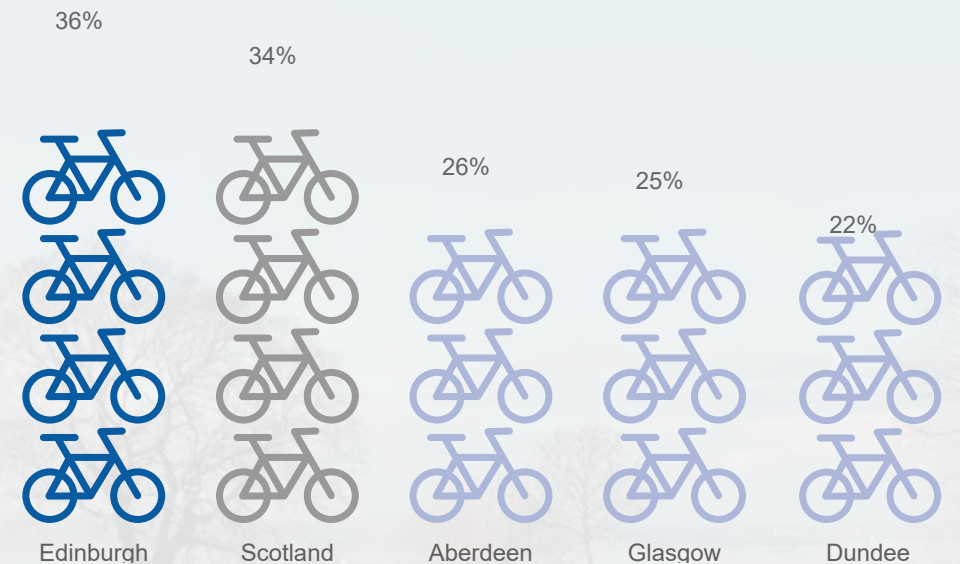


Days per week people walk in Edinburgh 2024

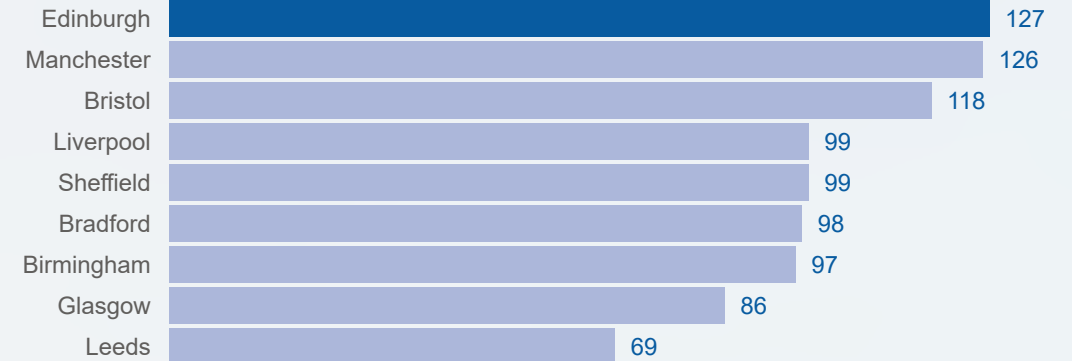
Key Facts

In 2025, Edinburgh commuters lost 127 days to rush hour delays. A 6-mile commute takes nearly 10% longer in the morning and over 16% longer in the evening. However, Edinburgh's evening peak times are still better than most major cities.

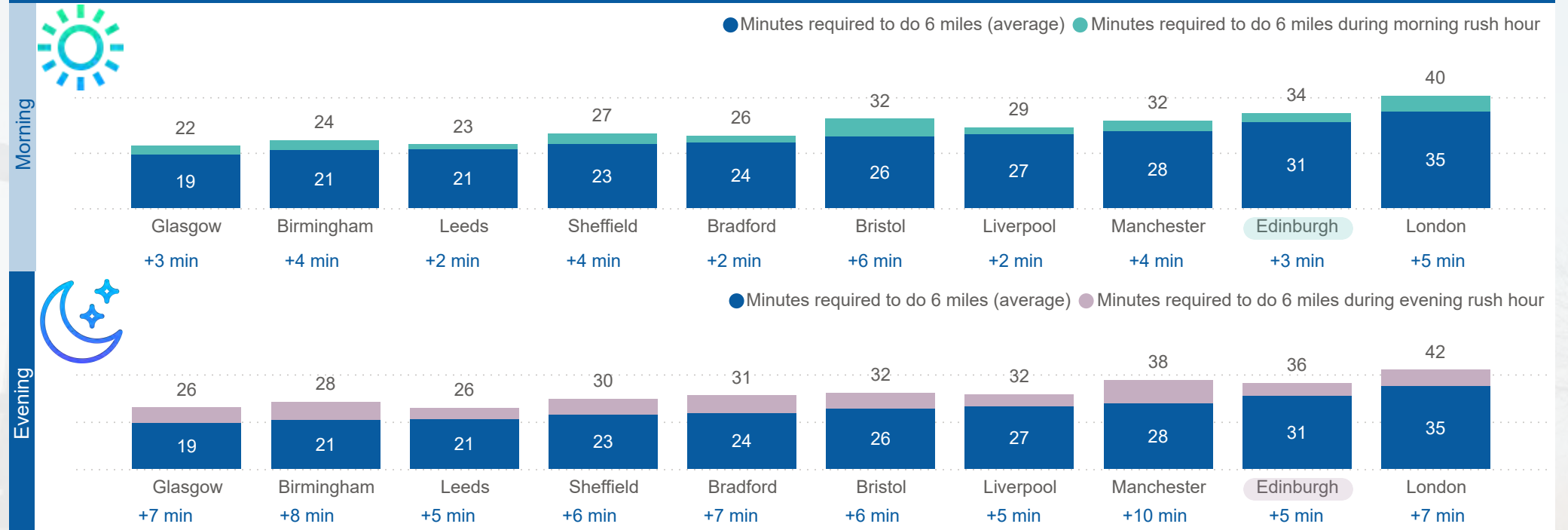
Did you know?
