I would like to make it known that as a resident and member of the Blackhall community, I would like to favourably support the request by Blackhall Community Trust to take ownership of the land and building indicated by the redline boundary plan.

I strongly believe that the Blackhall community needs a good quality local nursery and appreciate the efforts of the Trust to make this a reality. The current building is increasingly unfit for purpose despite staff and management's best efforts and understand this process to be necessary to proceed with any improvement to the nursery's physical environment. The benefits of the current location are of significant importance to the nursery as it offers not only a connection to the community but direct access to the green space and natural woodland environment beside it.
