### THE CITY OF EDINBURGH COUNCIL (KING'S ROAD & KING'S PLACE) (TEMPORARY TRAFFIC REGULATION) ORDER 2022 - TEMP/22/127

THE CITY OF EDINBURGH COUNCIL in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 14 (1) (b) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf hereby make the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as "The City of Edinburgh Council (King's Road & King's Place) (Temporary Traffic Regulation) Order 2022" and shall come into operation on the First day of July Two thousand and twenty-two and shall remain in force up to and including the Thirty-first day of December Two thousand and twenty-two. The circumstances necessitating the restrictions within this Order, as stated in Article 4, will be subject to ongoing review and should it be determined that the restrictions are no longer required, then at that time the temporary restrictions shall be revoked by notice, under a separate Order.
2. In this Order the following phrases have the meanings respectively assigned to them:
  - "Article" means an Article of this Order;
  - "camper" means a vehicle constructed or adapted such that said vehicle is equipped with living accommodation;
  - "caravan" means a vehicle equipped for living in, static or otherwise and typically towed by car;
  - "caravanette" means a motor vehicle with an area at the back that is equipped as living accommodation;
  - "emergency service vehicles" means any vehicle being used for ambulance, fire or police purposes;
  - "exemption" means the circumstances described in Schedule 2 to this Order;
  - "living accommodation" in relation to a vehicle, means a bed, whether fixed or temporary, plus other facilities that might enable said vehicle to be used as habitation, such as, but not limited to, cooking and other kitchen-related facilities, toilet and shower;
  - "local authority" means The City of Edinburgh Council;
  - "mobile home" means a large caravan or prefabricated structure that is situated in one particular place and used as permanent or temporary living accommodation;
  - "motor vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 136 of the Road Traffic Regulation 1984 Act;
  - "pedal cycle" shall have the meaning assigned to that phrase by section 151 of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984;
  - "road" has the same meaning as in Section 151 of the Roads (Scotland) act 1984 and, for the avoidance of doubt, for the purposes of this order, includes part of a road.
3. References in this Order to a disabled person, to a disabled person's badge, to a disabled person's vehicle and to a vehicle displaying a disabled person's badge in the relevant position shall be construed in accordance with the 1984 Act, The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Scotland) Regulations 2000 and The Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (Scotland) Regulations 2002.
4. Save as provided in Article 5, to facilitate improved safety for pedestrians and cyclists during the current Covid-19 pandemic, supporting social distancing so that people can safely walk, wheel or cycle, no person shall, (as signed as affected by the works): -
  - (a) cause or permit any motor vehicle to enter or proceed into or on any length of road described in column 1 of Schedule 1 to this Order;
  - (b) except with the permission of a Parking Attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on:
    - i. **King's Place, south-west side**, from a point 9.9 metres or thereby north-west of the extended northern kerbline of King's Road, north-westwards for a distance of 11 metres or thereby; and

- ii. **King's Road, south side**, from a point 20.3 metres or thereby west of the extended south-western kerbline of King's Place, westwards for a distance of 17.5 metres or thereby; and
  - (c) except with the permission of a Parking Attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait, load or unload at any time on:
    - i. **King's Road, north side**, from the extended south-western kerbline of King's Place, westwards for a distance of 12.2 metres or thereby;
    - ii. **Kings Road, south side**, from the extended south-western kerbline of King's Place, westwards for a distance of 20.3 metres or thereby;
    - iii. **King's Place, south-west side**, from the extended northern kerbline of King's Road, north-westwards for a distance of 9.9 metres or thereby;
    - iv. **King's Place, south-west, north-west, north-east and south sides**, from a point 20.9 metres or thereby north-west of the extended northern kerbline of King's Road, north-westwards, north-eastwards, south-eastwards and then westwards to a point where the extended south-western kerbline of King's Place meets the southern kerbline of King's Place.
5. Nothing in:
- (a) Article 4 shall apply to emergency service vehicles;
  - (b) Article 4(a) shall apply to any vehicle described or specified in Schedule 2 to this Order, subject to the conditions imposed within that Schedule, where the corresponding reference in column 1 of that Schedule is contained within column 2 of Schedule 1;
  - (c) Article 4(b) shall apply so as to prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in any road described in said Article while the vehicle is in actual use for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or while loading or unloading goods from or to premises adjoining the said road; provided that:
    - i. no such vehicle so engaged shall wait for a period of more than thirty minutes in the same place; and
    - ii. no such vehicle so engaged shall return to the same place, unless a period of more than thirty minutes has elapsed since the termination of the previous waiting period.
  - (d) Article 4(b) shall apply to a vehicle displaying a valid disabled person's badge, provided that said vehicle is being used by, or for the conveyance of, the holder of a valid disabled person's badge.
6. Whilst this Order continues in force, 'The City of Edinburgh Council (Traffic Regulation; Restrictions on Waiting, Loading and Unloading, Stopping and Parking Places) Designation and Traffic Regulation Order 2018' will be suspended in so far as it is affected by the measures described in Article 4 of this Order.

**SCHEDULE 1  
PROHIBITION OF MOTOR VEHICLES**

Lengths of road in the City of Edinburgh in which, with certain exceptions, motor vehicles are prohibited from entering or proceeding:

<b>1.</b>	<b>2.</b>
<b>Road in Edinburgh</b>	<b>Exemptions</b>
All that part of <b>King's Place</b> as extends from a point 5 metres north-west of the extended north-west kerbline of King's Road, north-westwards to the access to Portobello promenade (a distance of 100 metres or thereby), except for all that part of King's Place as is bounded on the south-west by the south-west kerbline of King's Place and extends 3.5 metres or thereby north-eastwards from that kerbline from the north-west kerbline of King's Road for a distance of 20.9 metres or thereby north-westwards.	1 & 2

**SCHEDULE 2  
EXEMPTION FROM SCHEDULE 1**

For the purposes of the application of this Order to any road specified in Schedule 1 the expression:

1	Means a vehicle being used for the purpose of removing a camper, caravan, caravanette or mobile home from any length of road described in column 1 of Schedule 1 to this Order provided that: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(a) said vehicle has been authorised by the local authority to be used for the aforementioned purpose;</li> <li>(b) the vehicle is materially required to be used in the road listed in Schedule 1; and</li> <li>(c) notice is given twenty-four hours in advance to the Executive Director of Place and his consent, either generally or specifically, has been obtained and such reasonable conditions he may impose are complied with.</li> </ul>
2	To enable a camper or caravanette to be removed from any length of road described in column 1 of Schedule 1 to this Order provided that: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(a) said vehicle has been authorised by the local authority to be used for the aforementioned purpose;</li> <li>(b) the vehicle is materially required to be used in the road listed in Schedule 1; and</li> </ul> notice is given twenty-four hours in advance to the Executive Director of Place and his consent, either generally or specifically, has been obtained and such reasonable conditions he may impose are complied with.
