## THE CITY OF EDINBURGH COUNCIL (CRAIGLEITH ROAD & ORCHARD ROAD) (TEMPORARY ROAD RESTRICTION AND TRAFFIC REGULATION) ORDER 2022 -TEMP/22/119

THE CITY OF EDINBURGH COUNCIL in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 14 (1) (b) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf hereby make the following Order: -

- 1. This Order may be cited as "The City of Edinburgh Council (Craigleith Road & Orchard Road) (Temporary Road Restriction and Traffic Regulation) Order 2022" and shall come into operation on the Eighth day of September Two thousand and twenty-two and shall remain in force up to and including the Thirty-first day of December Two thousand and twenty-two. The circumstances necessitating the restrictions within this Order, to facilitate improved safety for pedestrians and cyclists during the current Covid-19 pandemic, supporting social distancing so that people can safely walk, wheel or cycle, will be subject to ongoing review and should it be determined that the restrictions are no longer required, then at that time the temporary restrictions shall be revoked by notice, under a separate Order.
- 2. References in this Order to a disabled person, to a disabled person's badge, to a disabled person's vehicle and to a vehicle displaying a disabled person's badge in the relevant position shall be construed in accordance with the 1984 Act, The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Scotland) Regulations 2000 and The Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (Scotland) Regulations 2002.
- 3. Save as provided in Article 4 of this Order, no person shall, except with the permission of a Parking Attendant, cause or permit any vehicle: -
  - (a) to wait at any time on Craigleith Road, *south side*, from a point 38 metres or thereby west of the extended western kerbline of Orchard Road, westwards for a distance of 57 metres or thereby; and
  - (b) to wait, load or unload, at any time, on any parts of; (i) Craigleith Road, *south side*, from the extended western kerbline of Orchard Road, westwards for a distance of 38 metres or thereby; and (ii) Orchard Road, *west side*, from the extended southern kerbline of Craigleith Road, southwards for a distance of 31 metres or thereby.
- 4. Nothing in:
  - (a) Article 3 shall apply to emergency service vehicles;
  - (b) Article 3(a) shall apply so as to prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in any road described in said Article while the vehicle is in actual use for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or while loading or unloading goods from or to premises adjoining the said road; provided that:
    - i. no such vehicle so engaged shall wait for a period of more than thirty minutes in the same place; and
    - ii. no such vehicle so engaged shall return to the same place, unless a period of more than thirty minutes has elapsed since the termination of the previous waiting period.
  - (c) Article 3(a) shall apply to a vehicle displaying a valid disabled person's badge, provided that said vehicle is being used by, or for the conveyance of, the holder of a valid disabled person's badge.

5. Whilst this Order continues in force, 'The City of Edinburgh Council (Traffic Regulation; Restrictions on Waiting, Loading and Unloading, Stopping and Parking Places) Designation and Traffic Regulation Order 2018' will be suspended in so far as it is affected by the measures described in Article 3 of this Order.
