THE CITY OF EDINBURGH COUNCIL (MEADOW PLACE ROAD) (TEMPORARY ROAD RESTRICTION AND TRAFFIC REGULATION) ORDER 2022 - TEMP/22/121

THE CITY OF EDINBURGH COUNCIL in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 14 (1) (b) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf hereby make the following Order: -

- 1. This Order may be cited as "The City of Edinburgh Council (Meadow Place Road) (Temporary Road Restriction and Traffic Regulation) Order 2022" and shall come into operation on the Eighth day of September Two thousand and twenty-two and shall remain in force up to and including the Thirty-first day of December Two thousand and twenty-two. The circumstances necessitating the restrictions within this Order, as stated in Article 3, will be subject to ongoing review and should it be determined that the restrictions are no longer required, then at that time the temporary restrictions shall be revoked by notice, under a separate Order.
- 2. (a) In this Order the following phrases have the meanings respectively assigned to them:

"Article" means an Article of this Order;

"Parking Attendant" has the same meaning as in Section 63A of the 1984 Act;

"road" has the same meaning as in Section 151 of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984 and for the avoidance of doubt, for the purposes of this order, includes part of a road;

"vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 151 of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984;

- (b) References in this Order to a disabled person, to a disabled person's badge, to a disabled person's vehicle and to a vehicle displaying a disabled person's badge in the relevant position shall be construed in accordance with the 1984 Act, The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Scotland) Regulations 2000 and The Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (Scotland) Regulations 2002.
- 3. To facilitate improved safety for pedestrians and cyclists during the current Covid-19 pandemic, supporting social distancing so that people can safely walk, wheel or cycle, no person shall, except with the permission of a Parking Attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on any part of: (i) **Broomhouse Road**, *west side*, from a point 8 metres or thereby south of the extended southern kerbline of Forrester Park Drive, southwards to a point 80 metres or thereby north of the extended northern kerbline of Bankhead Drive; and (ii) **Ladywell Road**: (a) *north side*: (i) from a point 96 metres or thereby east of the extended eastern kerbline of Meadow Place Road, eastwards to a point 148 metres or thereby west of the extended western kerbline of Featherhall Avenue; (ii) from a point 139 metres or thereby east of the extended eastern kerbline of Meadow Place Road, eastwards to a point 65 metres or thereby west of the extended western kerbline of Featherhall Avenue; and (iii) from a point 51 metres or thereby west of the extended western kerbline of Featherhall Avenue, eastwards to a point 37 metres or thereby west of the extended western kerbline of Featherhall Avenue; and (b) *south side*, from a point 34 metres or thereby west of the extended western kerbline of Dunsmuir Court, eastwards to a point 10 metres or thereby west of the extended western kerbline of Ladywell Court.

4. Nothing in Article 3:

- (a) shall apply so as to prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in any road described in said Article while the vehicle is in actual use for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or while loading or unloading goods from or to premises adjoining the said road; provided that:
 - i. no such vehicle so engaged shall wait for a period of more than thirty minutes in the same place; and
 - ii. no such vehicle so engaged shall return to the same place, unless a period of more than thirty minutes has elapsed since the termination of the previous waiting period.
- (b) shall apply to a vehicle displaying a valid disabled person's badge, provided that said vehicle is being used by, or for the conveyance of, the holder of a valid disabled person's badge.

- 5. 'The City of Edinburgh Council (Traffic Regulation; Restrictions on Waiting, Loading and Unloading, Stopping and Parking Places) Designation and Traffic Regulation Order 2018' will be suspended in so far as it is affected by the measures described in Article 3 of this Order.
- 6. No person shall, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 20 miles per hour on: (i) **Broomhouse Road**, from a point 3 metres or thereby north of the extended northern kerbline of Forrester Park Drive, southwards to a point 33 metres of thereby north of the extended northern kerbline of Bankhead Drive; and (ii) **Meadow Place Road**, from a point 3 metres or thereby north of the extended northern kerbline of Forrester Park Drive, northwards to a point 43 metres or thereby south of the extended southern kerbline of Ladywell Road.
