THE CITY OF EDINBURGH COUNCIL (DUDDINGSTON ROAD WEST AREA)
(TEMPORARY ROAD RESTRICTION AND TRAFFIC REGULATION) ORDER 2022 -
TEMP/22/123

THE CITY OF EDINBURGH COUNCIL in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 14 (1) (b) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf hereby make the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as "The City of Edinburgh Council (Duddingston Road West Area) (Temporary Road Restriction and Traffic Regulation) Order 2022" and shall come into operation on the Twenty-ninth day of September Two thousand and twenty-two and shall remain in force up to and including the Thirty-first day of December Two thousand and twenty-two. The restrictions within this Order, to facilitate improved safety for pedestrians and cyclists during the current Covid-19 pandemic, supporting social distancing so that people can safely walk, wheel or cycle, will be subject to ongoing review and should it be determined that the restrictions are no longer required, then at that time the temporary restrictions shall be revoked by notice, under a separate Order.
2. (a) In this Order the following phrases have the meanings respectively assigned to them:
 - "Article" means an Article of this Order;
 - "Parking Attendant" has the same meaning as in Section 63A of the 1984 Act;
 - "road" has the same meaning as in Section 151 of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984 and for the avoidance of doubt, for the purposes of this order, includes part of a road;
 - "Schedule" means a Schedule to this Order;
 - "vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 151 of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984.(b) References in this Order to a disabled person, to a disabled person's badge, to a disabled person's vehicle and to a vehicle displaying a disabled person's badge in the relevant position shall be construed in accordance with the 1984 Act, The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Scotland) Regulations 2000 and The Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (Scotland) Regulations 2002.
3. Save as provided in Article 4, no person shall, except with the permission of a Parking Attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to:
 - (a) wait at any time on **both sides** of **Duddingston Road West**, from a point 6.5 metres or thereby east of the extended eastern kerbline of Calvary Park Drive, eastwards to a point 8 metres or thereby west of the extended southern kerbline of Milton Road West; and
 - (b) to wait, load or unload, at any time on (i) **Duddingston Road West, both sides**, from a point 39 metres or thereby east of the extended eastern kerbline of The Causeway, westwards and then southwards to a point 280 metres or thereby south of the extended southern kerbline of Old Church Lane; (ii) **Meadowfield Drive, both sides**, from the extended northern kerbline of Duddingston Road West, northwards for a distance of 14 metres or thereby; (iii) **Calvary Park Drive, east side**, from the extended southern kerbline of Duddingston Road West, southwards for a distance of 9.5 metres or thereby; (iv) **Meadowfield Avenue, both sides**, from the extended northern kerbline of Duddingston Road West, northwards for a distance of 11 metres or thereby; (v) **Woodlands Grove, both sides**, from the extended southern kerbline of Duddingston Road West, southwards for a distance of 6 metres or thereby; (vi) **Meadowfield Gardens, both sides**, from the extended northern kerbline of Duddingston Road West, northwards for a distance of 10 metres or thereby; and (vii) **Old Church Lane**: (a) **north side**, from the extended north-western kerbline of Duddingston Road West, south-westwards for a distance of 8 metres or thereby; and (b) **south side**, from the extended north-western kerbline of Duddingston Road West, south-westwards for a distance of 10 metres or thereby.

4. Nothing in Article 3(a):
- (a) shall apply so as to prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in any road described in said Article while the vehicle is in actual use for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or while loading or unloading goods from or to premises adjoining the said road; provided that:
 - i. no such vehicle so engaged shall wait for a period of more than thirty minutes in the same place; and
 - ii. no such vehicle so engaged shall return to the same place, unless a period of more than thirty minutes has elapsed since the termination of the previous waiting period.
 - (b) shall apply to a vehicle displaying a valid disabled person's badge, provided that said vehicle is being used by, or for the conveyance of, the holder of a valid disabled person's badge.
5. Whilst this Order continues in force, 'The City of Edinburgh Council (Traffic Regulation; Restrictions on Waiting, Loading and Unloading, Stopping and Parking Places) Designation and Traffic Regulation Order 2018' will be suspended in so far as it is affected by the measures described in Article 3 of this Order.
6. No person shall, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 20 miles per hour on **Duddingston Road West**, from a point 23 metres or thereby north of the extended northern kerbline of Peffermill Road, northwards and then eastwards to a point 14 metres or thereby west of the extended western kerbline of Milton Road West.
7. Whilst this Order continues in force, 'The City of Edinburgh Council (Roads Adjacent to Schools, Edinburgh) (Variable Speed Limit) Order 2003' will be suspended in so far as it is affected by the measures described in Article 6 of this Order.
