

Access Protection Markings Terms and Conditions

1. The property the request is being made for must have a private entrance or driveway.
2. The property the request is being made for must have a properly constructed dropped kerb, which Inspectors shall assess as part of the application process.
3. If there is no dropped kerb, then a permit must be applied for and approved by the Council before work can start to create one. You can find out more about how to apply for a dropped crossing permit on our website, please visit www.edinburgh.gov.uk/roads-pavements/road-occupation-permits for more information.
4. The dropped kerb and associated footway must not be damaged, broken, missing or be in a condition that it is likely to cause injury to pedestrians.
5. Access Protection Markings are advisory only, meaning they cannot be enforced by the Council. For any situation where you experience obstructive parking on an Access Protection Marking, the Police should be contacted. You can get more information on their website, please visit: www.scotland.police.uk/contact-us/ as they may have powers to intervene in such situations.
6. Payments for this service must be made via the Council's website prior to any work taking place. If investigations establish that an Access Protection Marking will not be provided at this location, all payments will be refunded automatically.
