- Should children have the vote?


Extra Challenge: Can you think of your own topic to discuss?

Extra challenge: Order them from lightest to heaviest. If you have weighing scales can you weigh them to check?

Main challenge How much does it cost her to send both the letter and the parcel?

Extra challenge: Marie gives £1. How much change does she get?

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Spelling task resource


LOOk	Look at the word. How many parts are there? What are the tricky bits? Can you find any spelling patterns?




