




Literacy and English - Grammar



Starter - Read for 25 minutes a day. Read a story, a newspaper, a comic that you have at home.


Main Challenge - Find some examples of figurative language

Literacy and English - Film review





Starter - **Think** of a film you like. Talk about the film in English or in your home language with someone in your home.

Extra challenge:


If your birthday was half-way between Christmas one year and Christmas the next year, when would it be?


Social Studies - Weather Make a simple rain gauge
