Paying your rent is a priority. You are responsible for the paying the full rent in advance for your home.

## **Ways to Pay Rent**



Pay by direct debit - Direct debit is the quickest, safest and easiest way to pay your Council rent. We can now set up weekly fortnightly or monthly payments on any date that suits you. Contact your locality office or telephone your Housing Officer today to set this up.





Pay Online - You can pay online on our website at <a href="https://www.edinburgh.gov.uk/waystopaycouncilrent">www.edinburgh.gov.uk/waystopaycouncilrent</a> with a credit or debit card. You will need your 9 or 10 digit rent reference number on the front of your Rent Payment Card.



**Pay at PayPoint** – You can use your rent payment card at any PayPoint. You will find hundreds of these in local shops, post offices and newsagents across the Edinburgh area. Use your postcode on the PayPoint website to search for your nearest PayPoint outlet <a href="https://paypoint.com/">https://paypoint.com/</a>.



**Pay by telephone** – The Council automated telephone line is available 24/7 on **0800 7831719**, you will need your debit card and rent payment card details

# **Understanding your Quarterly Rent Statement**

Do we owe you money? Your final balance shows on the last line before the end of your rent statement. If you have a credit balance due to you, the amount will show under the column headed **Balance Due to Council.**Tenant. If you have a rent debt the amount will show under the column headed **Balance Due to Council.** 

To request a refund to your bank account email your rent payment reference, name and address with your sort code and bank account number to <a href="mailto:rentfirst@edinburgh.gov.uk">rentfirst@edinburgh.gov.uk</a> and we will arrange to process your request.

#### **Rent Debt**

If you have rent debt it is very important for you to get this sorted out as soon as possible. Contact your Housing Officer as soon as you start experiencing difficulties, they will be able to provide advice and set up a suitable payment arrangement.

If you do not make/keep up an arrangement to pay your arrears, you could risk losing your home.

If you get help to pay your rent through Housing Benefit or Universal Credit, you are responsible for making sure you update your claim and you are responsible for providing all the information required. If you need further rent details ask your Housing Officer.

### Universal Credit – You will need to pay your full rent direct to us – read below

Important rent information you will need to make a claim and report any changes in your circumstances through your online journal. This includes your rent increase, when you move home, income and household changes.

- Your landlord is The City of Edinburgh Council.
- > Use your full tenancy address from the letters we send you when you make a claim for Universal Credit, for example your rent increase letter or rent statement
- > Tell them your fortnightly rent charge
- ➤ Tell them your fortnightly service charges too, if you have any. You also need to say which service charges are <u>eligible</u> to get help with (Stair Cleaning, Core Furnishings) and those that are <u>ineligible</u> (Insurance and Heating)
- Tell them the number of bedrooms you have in your home
- Tell them you have number (0) rent free weeks

## **Help for Council Tenants**
