CGF Overview

- The total amount of funding available in 2024/25 was higher than the opening balance (£405,769) because some funds were returned (£11,527) in 2024/25 by recipients who were unable to spend their whole grant.
- We worked with 163 volunteer funding panel members.
- Three funding rounds were held in the 2024/25 funding cycle (i.e. three application deadlines).
 - Round 1 City Centre, Liberton & Gilmerton and Portobello & Craigmillar were fully allocated.
 - Round 2 Southside & Newington was fully allocated.
 - Round 3 All remaining neighbourhood area funds were fully allocated except Inverleith which had an underspend of £5590.
- There was a 30% increase in applications received compared to 2023/24.
- There was a 20% increase in successful applications compared to 2023/24.
- Overall, the total value of all applications was 2.6 times the amount of funding available.
- The fund was oversubscribed in every neighbourhood area. The total value of applications to each neighbourhood was approximately between 1.5 and 3 times the amount of funding available.
