Construction Works Shut Down

Construction on Edinburgh's Trams to Newhaven project is on hold to protect the safety of workers and residents during the current Coronavirus outbreak.

The project continues to follow guidance from the Scottish Government as to when the project can recommence, and we will provide further updates via the project website, Twitter and Instagram social media accounts, and this newsletter.

The project has been working on plans to ensure we fully comply with Scottish Government guidance when the project recommences and on way of mitigating the impact of the enforced shut down on programme and costs. In addition, we are reviewing the site set up to identify ways of assisting with social / physical distancing.

The existing traffic management on Constitution Street, Lindsay Road and Ocean Drive remains in place. The construction sites are inspected daily to ensure they are safe and secure and emergency services have access to all sites at all times in the event they require it.



Recent essential gas and BT maintenance works

Morrison Utility Services (MUS) recently completed some essential gas maintenance works on Constitution Street.

Works are still ongoing on Constitution Street from Baltic Street Junction to Tower Street to install ducting to support BT Openreach to protect and maintain their digital network. BT Openreach will have a presence on site for the following six weeks.

The project is committed to keeping our workforce and the public safe and to reduce the risk of spreading the COVID 19 virus. Additional Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), including visers, and regular safety briefings are given to workers. We will be continuously monitoring working practices.

The works will be carried out during the normal working hours for the project which are 7am – 7pm Monday to Friday and 8am – 1pm on Saturdays.


Volunteer Edinburgh has a dedicated <u>webpage</u> which provides advice on how to help during the COVID-19 Pandemic.
